THE COURSE SELECTION PROCESS: STEP-BY-STEP

- Counselors will review every student's transcript and verify credits earned and credits still needed for graduation.
- Counselors will guide students on what they still need to take. These include:
 - English, math, science, social studies
 - Endorsement elective
 - Required electives still needed (PE/health)
- Students are able to choose Pre-AP, AP or Dual Credit core classes instead of on-level classes.
- Students are able to choose their language other than English classes.
 (Spanish or French, regular or native, Pre-AP, AP or Dual Credit)
- **Students** are able to choose their Fine Arts class.
- Students are able to choose other classes instead of PE (Athletics, JROTC1, Band, Sweethearts, and Cheer).
- Students are able to choose their remaining electives not required for graduation.

THE COURSE SELECTION PROCESS

This process is driven by the credits the student has earned and the credits they still need to earn to meet graduation requirements.

SOMETHING TO CONSIDER: PRE -AP/ AP & DUAL CREDIT

- Woodrow offers Pre-AP, AP, and Dual Credit classes.
- These classes are academically challenging and help prepare you for college.
- You could earn free college credit while in high school!
- To do well in these courses, you must be motivated, have good time management skills, and be able to work independently.
- Students in grades 9-12 may select pre-AP or AP classes, but will be REQUIRED to sign a
 Pre-AP/AP contract. (copies available tonight)
- Students in grades 11 or 12 may take dual credit classes offered by DCCCD (Dallas County Community College District) but must apply and be accepted into the program.
- The dual credit application process is taking place soon. See your counselor if you're interested in taking a dual credit course.

LINK CREW

- Open to ALL <u>juniors and seniors</u> from all backgrounds <u>on track</u> to graduate
- Year-long program to <u>mentor incoming freshmen</u>
- For students who want to make a difference at Woodrow
- What would mentors do?
 - Each mentor would <u>support a group of 8 freshmen</u> for the year
 - Help with Orientation
 - Follow up with the group throughout the year
 - Attend the Link Crew class for training and support, run by Hall, Hlavaty, and Regenye during a lunch period (so there will be built-in time to regularly check in with all freshmen in each group)
- This looks great on college applications!





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- Your student will receive a course selection sheet that lists their current schedule.
 The students will receive these documents on:
 - Current 9th-11th Grade-February 5 & 6 (Wed/Thu) through their English class.
 - Current 8th Grade- Between February 6-10. The middle school counselor will distribute.
 - If students are absent the day this is handed out, they will need to pick-up the documents from the counselor at their school.
- Students should share their course selection sheet with their parents.
- Students and parents should review the information and make selections on the sheet provided. SIGNATURES ARE REQUIRED!
- Please make sure you choose 3 alternate (alt) electives in the provided boxes on the course sheet.
- Please have course selection sheets & Pre-AP/AP contracts completed by:
 - Monday, February 10- Current 9th-11th Grade
 - Tuesday, February 11- Current 8th Grade

- Over the next few weeks, counselors will be meeting with students through their Social Studies class to help finalize course selections and to input them into PowerSchool. <u>Counselors will be in classrooms for course selection on the</u> <u>following days</u>:
 - Current 8th Grade- February 11 & 12 (Tue/Wed)
 - Current 9th-11th Grade-February 10, 13, 18, 19, and 21 (Mon/Thu/Tue/Wed/Fri)
 - Current 10th IB grade students- February 7
 - Remember, students will select their courses through their Social Studies class.
 - If students are absent the day we come to their class, they will need to complete the process with their counselor at a later date.
- All courses must be selected in PowerSchool no later than Friday, February 28.

- Changes in Fall 2020 will be limited and will not include elective changes. Students and parents will have <u>one last opportunity to review their course selection and make changes in early May to lock choices in for the 2020-2021 school year.</u>
- IB students will have separate break out sessions throughout the Spring semester to assure accuracy of course selection for the IB Diploma Programme.
