## OUR MISSION...

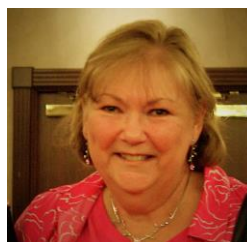

To date, fiscal year 2019 (June 1,2018 to September 30, 2018) volunteers at the DCCS office have given 41 hats/turbans and/or scarves; 58 wigs; 12 breast prosthesis and/or bras. Our volunteers also assisted 416 visitors and answered 259 telephone calls.

During this time period, Douglas County cancer patients came to us with breast, bladder, bone, lymph node, bowel, stomach, cervical, colon, esophageal, genetic hemochromatosis, glioblastoma, leukemia, large cell lymphoma, liver, lung, myeloma, ovarian, tongue, pancreatic, peritoneal, rectal, shunt, thyroid, uterine and waldenstroms macroglobulinoma cancers.

It is an honor to assist cancer patients, ease their burden and allow for them to focus on their healing.

The DCCS Board of Directors constantly strive to provide support and services to cancer patients.
