

The Centre's core activity provides six exhibition spaces and with the main emphasis on the visual arts, creates varied opportunities for the local and regional community to participate in and enjoy arts-related events.

The Centre has a policy of accessibility and inclusivity and in hosting some 150 shows and exhibits during the year welcomes many artists who hire the spaces to present their own work. Exhibitions range from painting and sculpture to pottery, jewellery, photography and decorative and applied arts.

The gallery offers free entry and is visited during the year by some 45,000 people to view exhibitions presented by professional artists, leisure painters and art clubs.
