Kitchen update. Thanks to Barry and Bruce for the great job on the kitchen ceiling, they also installed new lights, what a difference.


Seniors dinners are going quite well. For those that do not know, Crystal, Ryan's wife will be performing the 2nd Tuesday of the month in October and November.


