

DAY & NIGHT QUESTIONS

According to **Genesis 1:14**, what YAH, Our Creator gave us the lights in the heavens to determine our days and years.

Questions	Answers
Lights or darkness (nights)?	Lights. Gen. 1:14 , notice not darkness (nights), but "lights. Click here for a visual layout.
In Gen. 1:5 , does the word day mean light or does it mean light and darkness?	The word day means light only. Gen. 1:3-4 .
At 12:00 midnight, is that the middle of the night or the middle of the day?	It is the middle of the night, because the middle of the day comes after the morning and before the evening. I Kings 18:26-29
Is 2 Samuel 2:32, Judges 19:25 and Job 7:4 speaking about the beginning of a day, or the ending of a day?	It is speaking about the beginning of a day.

Questions	Answers
<p>Was the sun made to rule over the day or was it made to rule over the night?</p>	<p>Gen. 1:14-18. The days, not the nights are darkness.</p>
<p>If the sun was made to rule over the day, then how can a day begin at night when the sun is not ruling?</p>	<p>Totally impossible. Psalm 136:7-9.</p>
<p>Is it possible for my son to remain at your house all day without spending the night?</p>	<p>Yes, because when a day ends, the night begins. Psalm 104:20.</p>
<p>In Lev. 7:15, it says, the flesh of the sacrifice of his peace offerings for thanksgiving shall be eaten the same day that it is offered; he shall not leave any of it until the morning. Does the word morning, in this verse indicate the morning that is connected to the previous evening, or the morning that is connected to a new day?</p>	<p>New day. Numbers 28:3-4 this verse also proves the evening is part of the previous day, not the beginning of a new day.</p>
<p>In Exodus 18:13 it states: And it came to pass on the morrow, that Moses sat to judge the people: and the people stood by Moses from the morning unto the evening. When does morrow begin; in the evening, night or in the morning?</p>	<p>Morning, as all of the scriptures clearly indicate. I have never found a scripture where the morrow starts in the evening or the night.</p>

Questions	Answers
<p>According to Exodus 16:22-25, when does the Rest of the Holy Sabbath unto YAH begin, in the night, evening or in the morning?</p>	<p>Morning or morrow, as all new days begin.</p>
<p>If a night is considered a day, then what did YAH mean when He said that He caused it to rain forty days and forty nights?</p>	<p>A night is not considered a day. Psalm 104:20.</p>
<p>If a day starts when it becomes dark, then why is darkness always pertained to as night, and never pertained to as day? (Psalm 104:20); except when it is speaking about the "day of YAH's wrath."?</p>	<p>A day does not start when it becomes dark, because YAH totally separated the light from the darkness. Gen. 1:18.</p>
<p>Gen. 8:22 reads, "While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease". The Most High gives us four different times and conditions. Are these times and conditions the same, or are they totally the opposite of one another ?</p>	<p>Totally the opposite of one another</p>

Questions	Answers
<p>According to the Words of The Most High, what is the difference between a day and a night? (Give scriptures please).</p>	<p>Day equals light, and darkness equals night. Jer. 31:35 and Psalm 136:7-9.</p>
<p>In Jer. 33:19-21, YAH speaks about the evil that he would bring upon the house of David and kingdom of Israel, if they broke His covenants that there should not be day or night in their season (Psalm 22:2). What is the season of the day, and what is the season of the night?</p>	<p>The sun is the season of the day, and the moon is the season of the night Jer. 31:35.</p>
<p>Outside of the way that many of you might interpret Genesis 1st Chapter, is there anywhere else in the Holy scriptures that says that evening and morning are a day?</p>	<p>No! Because, it is not, neither is Genesis 1st Chapter Support the claim that evening and morning is a day.</p>
<p>If a day starts in the evening when it becomes dark, then when does a night begin?</p>	<p>They do not both start simultaneously, if so, they would be the same. A day starts when it becomes light Judges 16:2, and a night starts when it becomes dark (Psalm 104:20). They are totally the opposite of one another Gen. 8:22.</p>

<p>If the celebration of our Sabbath days and our new moons (Isa. 66:23) begins in the evening when the sun is going down, why would Our Creator state that all nations shall praise His Name and worship Him from the "rising of the sun until the going down of the same sun</p>	<p>If the Sabbath started in the evening, as many of our people believe, then these verses would make no sense whatsoever. Malachi 1:11 reads, "For from the rising of the sun even unto the going down of the same, my name shall be great among the Gentiles, and in every place incense shall be offered unto my name, and a pure offering: for my name shall be great among the heathen, saith YAH of Hosts." Psalm 113:3 and Psalm 50:1.</p>
<p>How many hours in a day according to scripture?</p>	<p>According to John 11:9, it says 12 hours and sunrise to sunset is 12 hours. The traditional day which many of our people believe in, which is from sunset to sunset is not 12 hours.</p>
<p>If a Day begins the morning, why does Scripture say: Evening and Morning?</p>	<p>According to Genesis 1, the evening came after Yah completed his work for the Day.</p>

In Genesis 1 it says that Yah created the Heavens and the earth.
Why is this not considered apart of the 7 Day work week?

Gen 1:1-2 does express Creation, but it does not give a timetable. It says that Yah created Heaven, but does not go into detail about the host of heaven that he created.

Also, it says that Yah created Earth, but it does not constitute a Day beginning at night. Why?

Evening is the process of Light FADING...there was no light to fade prior to the creation of light.
Morning is the Process of darkness fading into DAY.

When Yah said: LET THERE BE LIGHT, The Darkness faded into Light thus Morning (by definition) was took place and Yah worked threw the light (day) until it came to be evening and the it came to be morning, One Day.

Is this below scripture in reference to a day beginning at night or at sunset or in the morning or at sunrise ?

Matthew 28:1

In the end of the Sabbath, as it began to **dawn toward the first day** of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre.

How can a day begin at night or at sunset when **Mathew 28:1** clearly say's dawn towards the first day, which is in reference to the beginning of the day, in consideration that it says "**in the end of the Sabbath**" which is reference to the end of the day before dawn, which ties into John 11:9 of 12 hours in a day and primarily sunrise to sunset is 12 hours.

Are both these below scriptures in reference to a day starting in the evening or at sunset?

Mark 16:2

And very early in the **morning the first day of the week**, they came unto the sepulchre at the **rising of the sun**.

Luke 24:1

Now upon the **first day of the week, very early in the morning**, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them.

The answer is no, both of these scriptures are examples that the day begins in the Morning at sunrise.

Does this below scripture in reference to Mary arriving to the sepulcher at night or at sunset or this scripture in reference to arriving to the sepulcher early in the morning before sunrise while it was still dark?

John 20:1

The **first day of the week** cometh Mary Magdalene **early**, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

In John 20:1 explains that Miryam from Magdala came early to the tomb, while it was **still dim**, and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb." Most translations translate the words "still **dim**" as "still **dark**". In fact, the Greek word "skotia" Strong's# 4653 primarily means '**dim**'

<p>If a day always started at night, then how could anyone change the night into day?</p>	<p>Totally impossible, but many are trying to do so, it could possibly bring about the total destruction of the House of Israel. Jer. 33:19-21.</p>
<p>How did Job recognize a day?</p>	<p>According to Job 3:9, 7:4 he signifies “the dawning of the day.” The definition of dawning is day break, start of a new day at dawn in the morning.</p>
<p><i>Would this below scripture give an indication that a day starts in the evening or at sunset?</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">John 13:27-30</p> <p>And after the piece of bread, Satan entered into him. Jesus (Yahshua), therefore, said to him, "What you do, do quickly." ²⁸ But no one at the table knew why He said this to him, ²⁹ for some were supposing, because Judas (Yahudas) had the bag, that Yahshua was saying to him, "<u>Buy what we need for the Festival,</u>" or that he should give somewhat to the poor. ³⁰ So, having received the piece of bread, he then <u>went out straightaway,</u> and <u>it was night.</u></p>	<p>Why would the disciples even be thinking that Yahshua would be asking Yahudas to BUY if the Festival of Unleavened Bread had started that night? It would be considered a High Sabbath on which no one would buy or sell! The obvious fact is that the Festival started in the MORNING on the 15th of Abib.</p>

A DAYLIGHT PERIOD OF WORK

(Matthew 20:1) For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard.

****NOTE:** This EVENT that takes places mentions 'The Morning' as the START of DAY. EARLY in the MORNING is not the EVENING.

(Matthew 20:2) When he had agreed with the laborers for a denarius for the day, he sent them into his vineyard.

****NOTE:** The Event furthers tells that from the 'Morning', it was DAY when the agreement was made.

(Matthew 20:3) About the third hour he went out and saw others

****NOTE:** The 3rd hour from that morning would have been 9:00 am according to their sundial which was used to determine their hours within a day.

(Matthew 20:4-5) and to those he said, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right I will give you.' And so they went. (5) 'Again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour, and did the same

****NOTE:** The 6th Hour is 12:00 pm, The 9th hour is 3:00 pm. Keep in mind that ancient Israelites did not work during night within a time period where electricity nor the light bulb was yet invented. So far the details are showing that this day was a daily event that took place in the morning.

(Matthew 20:6) And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day long?

****NOTE:** The 11th Hour would have been 5:00pm according to their sundial. Notice the question was: 'Why have you been standing here idle all day long? ALL THE DAY LONG refers to the precision of hours that's taken place since that Morning.

A DAYLIGHT PERIOD OF WORK - Continued

(Matthew 20:8) When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, ‘Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last group to the first.

*****NOTE:** Notice that so far the events that taken place within the Scriptural DAY began in the Morning and Ended in the Evening. The owner of the Vineyard Paid the workers in the EVENING AFTER the DAY was Over...

(Matthew 20:9) When those hired about the eleventh hour came, each one received a denarius.

(Matthew 20:10) When those hired first came, they thought that they would receive more; but each of them also received a denarius.

(Matthew 20:11) When they received it, they grumbled at the landowner,

(Matthew 20:12) saying, ‘These last men have worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden and the scorching heat of the day.

****NOTE:** The scorching heat of the day? There is no Scorching Heat during the NIGHT or EVENING. The Day as described Scripture Begins in the Morning and ENDS in the Evening and as per John 11:9 there is 12 hours within a day and sunrise (Morning) to sunset (Evening) primarily equals 12 hours.

Additional Clues:

1) Morning Mentioned in Mathew 20:1

2) Hours (Matthew 20:3), (Matthew 20:4-5), (Matthew 20:6) tells you what happened threw out the Day,
DETAILS, DETAILS, DETAILS

3) Evening, According to the Scripture takes place after the hours of the DAY which begins AT Morning. There’s no getting around it.
