Sun & Moon	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Genesis 1:14</u></p> <p>And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for <b>signs</b>, and for <b>seasons</b>, and for <b>days</b>, and <b>years</b>.</p>	<p>The sun &amp; Moon were placed as a time system to determine time throughout the days of the months throughout the year. Seasons in Hebrew is mowed, which means an appointment, (i.e. a fixed time)</p>
Sun & Moon	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Jeremiah 31:35</u></p> <p>Thus saith the Lord, which giveth the sun for <b>a light by day</b>, and the <b>ordinances of the moon</b> and of the stars for a light by night, which divideth the sea when the waves thereof roar; The Lord of hosts is his name.</p>	<p>Ordinances in Hebrew is chuqqah, which means something prescribed / enactment, usually with reference to matters of ritual.</p> <p>Nowhere in scripture says the Sun was given any ordinances to designate the days of the months throughout the year, as being the entire monthly / yearly cycle within the Gregorian calendar is governed the Sun.</p> <p>The sun was only created to govern the hours in a day as the first line of Jeremiah 31:35 say (Light by day)</p>
Sun	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Psalms 136:8</u></p> <p>The sun to rule by day: for his mercy endureth for ever</p>	<p>sun was only created to govern the hours in a day as the first line of Jeremiah 31:35 say (Light by day)</p>

<p>Moon</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Psalm 104:19</i></u></p> <p>He appointed the moon for seasons: the sun knoweth his going down.</p>	<p>Seasons in Hebrew is mowed, which means an appointment, (i.e. a fixed time)</p> <p>Nowhere in scripture implies that the Sun was made for seasons or a Mowed in comparison to the Julian / Gregorian calendar.</p>
<p>Moon</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Ecclesiasticus 43:6 (Apocrypha)</i></u></p> <p>He made the moon also to serve in her season for a declaration of times, and a sign of the world.</p>	<p>According to this script, the moon was created as a watch in the sky. The sun however was never made as a declaration of times to determine the days of the months throughout the year.</p>
<p>Moon</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u><i>Ezekiel 46:1</i></u></p> <p>Thus saith the Lord God; The gate of the inner court that looketh toward the east shall be shut the six working days; but on the sabbath it shall be opened, and in the <b>day of the new moon</b> it shall be opened.</p>	<p>This script says” day of the new Moon” or New moon day, which indicates that this day is considered day 1 and is governed by the moon and not by the Sun, which explains that the Moon constitutes all the days within the weekly / monthly cycle throughout the biblical lunar year.</p>
<p>Conclusion</p>	<p>If you analyze the Julian / Gregorian calendar, you will notice that this calendar has the entire months, years and days governed only by the Solar cycle and constituted by a winter / Summer solstice and a Spring / Autumn equinox. The calendar according to scripture is completely the opposite which is governed primarily by the lunar cycle, in reference to the days of the months throughout the year.</p>
