Information on Barbara Eitniew's parents follow:

Johannes Eidmeier (Edeneyer, Eidenier, Eidmeyer, Eydeneyer, Eytenier, Eytenior, Eytenoires, Itnyre) arrived at the Port of Philadelphia 4 October 1751 aboard the Queen of Denmark from Rotterdam, last from the Port of Cowes. He arrived with his wife, Anna Margreth (b.abt. 1729 d. after 1784 in Hagerstown, Washington County, MD. They had eight children; Elizabeth (b. 1751, possibly at sea or York County, PA), Anna Maria (b. August 1752, York County, PA, possibly Boonsboro, Washington County, MD), Mary (b. 1753, Boonsboro, Washington County, Md), Martin (b. 13 October 1755, Boonsboro, Washington County, MD d. 11 October 1823, Huntington County, PA m. Elizabeth Rohrer in 1774), Daniel ( b. 1756, Boonsboro, Washington County, MD m. Catherine Weast 20 December 1819 at Hagerstown, Washington County, MD), Johannes (b. 17 April 1762 Boonsboro, Washington County, MD d. October 1786, Hagerstown Washington County, MD m. Dorotheane Schechberin), Catherine Barbara (b. 1763, Boonsboro, Washington County, MD d. 31 August 1831, Warrior's Mark, Huntington County, PA m. Martin Funk), Lenhard (b. 30 August 1765, Boonsboro, Washington County, MD d. 13 December 1842, West Lebanon, Warren County, Indiana m. Suzanna Westlberger).
