After the death of his wife, Susan, in 1904, Evan remarried:

Served as a private in Company A, 50th Infantry Regiment of Virginia

Mustered out: 15 May 1864

Records show he was captured 4 July 1863 at South Mountain, MD (no record of a battle on this date?) and was paroled at Baltimore, MD, 23 Aug 1863, and delivered to City Point, VA on 24 Aug 1863.

Additional record shows that E C Livesay was admitted to a Union Hospital in Frederick, MD, 6 July 1863, 2 days after his capture, and then transferred to Baltimore 7 Aug 1863. Reason for admittance to hospital is unclear. Civil War Records follow:

PENSIONERS new on the ROLL are NOT required to make new application, but must file annual certificate.

Must be Filed with the Clerk of the Corporation or Circuit Court of your City or County. (No application will be entertained not on the printed form.)

FORM NO. 2.

APPLICATION of a Disabled Soldier, Sailor or Marine of the late Confederacy Under Act of 1912, as amended.

I, E. L. Livesey, do hereby apply for a pension under the provisions of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved March 12, 1912, as amended, entitled "An act to aid the citizens of Virginia who were disabled by wounds received during the war between the States while serving as soldiers, sailors, or marines of Virginia, and such as served during the said war as soldiers, sailors, or marines of Virginia, who are now disabled by disease contracted during the war, or by the infirmities of age..."

All questions must be answered fully—be explicit:

12. What is your usual and ordinary occupation for earning a livelihood? Farmer
14. Are you following such occupation or any other occupation or employment at this time? If yes, state the nature and extent of same. no, not able
16. What is your annual income? \$ nothing
18. How much property do you own? Real Estate \$ 30000 Personal Property \$ 5000

What is the exact nature of your disability and the cause thereof? Totally disabled by a stroke of Paralysis or something of the kind.

18. Are you totally or partially incapacitated by such disability? Totally from Farming

FORM NO. 7

APPLICATION of a widow of a Soldier, Sailor, or Marine of the late Confederacy under act approved March 26, 1928, as amended by acts approved 1928, 1930, 1932 and 1934.

I, Allie Livesay, do hereby apply for a pension under the provisions of the acts of the General Assembly of Virginia relating to Confederate pensions.

I do solemnly swear that I am a citizen of the State of Virginia and that I have been an actual resident of the said State for one year next preceding the date of this application, and that I am the widow of Evan Christopher Livesay who was a soldier (sailor or marine) in the service of the Confederate States in the War Between the States, and that I was married to him Aug. 28, 1907 (See note below) and to the best of my knowledge and belief during the said war my husband was loyal and true to his duty, and never at any time deserted his command or voluntarily abandoned his post of duty in the said service, and that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life but remained his lawful wife up to the time of his death, and that I am a widow at the date of making this application, and that I am now entitled to receive a pension under the provisions of said act. I do further swear that I do not hold a

national, State or county office, which pays a salary or fees exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum, nor have I income from any and all sources whatever exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum nor do I own in my own right, nor is there held in trust for my own benefit, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed in fee or for life, which yields a total income exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum. I do further swear that I do not receive a pension from this or any other State. I do solemnly swear that the answers given to the questions which I am required to answer in this application are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

Any assessment of property does not affect the right to pension, but the gross income from all sources must not exceed \$1,000.00 per year. Certificates under B, C, E, not necessary if husband was pensioner.

NOTE—Widows seventy-five years old or over can receive pension regardless of date of marriage. Widows under seventy-five years old are required to have been married prior to January 1st 1931.

16. Give the name and address of a comrade who served in the same command with your husband during the war if living. (Not necessary if your husband was a pensioner.) Name Address
17. Name source of income, and what income have you from all sources? Garden at my home. Am unable to work. NOTE—By income is meant the total gross receipts derived by you from all crops (whether sold or used), wages and all other sources valued in dollars.
18. Was your husband on the pension roll of Virginia? If yes, in what county or city was his pension allowed? Yes, Lee County, Va.
19. Have you ever applied for a pension in Virginia before? If yes, why are you not drawing one at this time? No
