Colonel George Lyddall had a Daughter - Ann. Colonel George Lyddall came to New Kent Co. Va and settled in St. Peter's Parish about 1650 from Suffolk Co. England. George Lyddall died 19 Jan. 1705 or 1706 in New Kent Co., Virginia. I have seen

George Lyddall listed as a Capt. in the WFT Vol II. George Lyddall was the fifth son of Thomas Lyddall and younger brother to Sir Thomas Lyddall.

Land patent, New Kent Co. VA, dated 1654. In 1657 a patent for 2390 acres in New Kent Co. along Black Creek, and on 12 Oct 1662 a patent of 3306 acres along both sides of Balck Creek, New Kent Co., of which 916 acres, newly taken up due for the transportation of 19 persons (Charles Farthing being one named). In 1679 was Commander in Chief of the fort in the Mattaponi River.

Col. George Lyddall was the fifth son of Thomas Lydall and a younger brother of Sir Thomas Lyddall who married Bridgett Woodards, daughter of George Woodward and Elizabeth Honniwood. George Lyddall and his family, together with other connected families came to Virginia to escape persecution by Cromwell. George Lyddall patented land in New Kent Co., VA in 1654. It would seem that he had two marriages, the name of his first wife being unknown. He lived to be a very old man, dying Jan. 10, 1705. The wife mentioned in his will was named Jane. George had four children: Elizabeth who married Thomas Wilkinson, unknown name - daughter who married Capt. Joseph Harwood, John who married Barbar Bowker (sister of Rev. Jas. Bowker) John died without issue. **Ann who married Edmund Bacon in 1682.** George (then Captain) Lyddall was in command of the Fort of Mattiponi during the Bacon Rebellion (1676). Reference: Clopton papers in Library of Duke University which include copy of the Will of George Lyddall and the record of marriage contract between Lyddall and Bacon.

Major George Lyddall commanded the fort at or near Mahixon on Pamunkie River [New Kent County] in charge of 61 men from York County , March 28, 1678 (Hennig, Statutes at Large . . . of Virginia , Vol. 2, p. 328). The forts in New Kent commanded by Col. Clayborne and Major George Lyddall discontinued, 1676 (Ibid., Vol. 2, p. 347). Several patents for land were granted Captain George Lyddall in 1654 , 1657 and 1662 , in New Kent County . * Colonel George Lyddall died January 19, 1705 (Register St. Peter's Parish, 1680-1787 , p. 64

The Valentine Papers, Vol 1-4, 1864-1908

WILL: signed 15 Nov 1703, proved 28 Jan 1705 at New Kent Court.

In the name of God Amen: I, George Lyddall of ye parish of St. Peter's in ye County of New Kent in Virga, Gemt: doe & impremis, I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son-in-law Capt. Joseph Harwood and his wife, my father and mother's pictures in Little, they have in their possession.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grandson George Wilkinson my mare Benny, ye first mare foul she brings maybe and remain in his sister Judith Wilkinson.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grandson Thomas Harwood, son of Capt. Joseph Harwood my Black Rapier.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my deare and loving wife Jane Lyddall my two Negroes by name Harry & Hannah & all their future increase and I hereby ordain and appoint my Beloved wife Jane Lyddall full and sole Executrix of this my last will and testament giving & bequeathing unto her all my whole Estate that remains after ye payment of ye above Legacies.

I say all my estate that remaineth both Real & personal whether here or in England, and in Witness whereof I have (revoking all other wills) set my hand and seale this fifteenth day of November 1703. Proved January 28th 1705 by ye oaths of Thomas Henson and James Melons. Witnesses: Thos. Henderson, Sarah Henderson, James Melons and Stephen Sunter.
