George's father left him 100 acres of land on James Island with the stipulation that "if my son George Rivers should not return home in two years after my decease then I will that my daughter, Ruth Bedon, have the use of 20 acres taken out of the said 100 acres ...for her natural life and the rest equally divided among my surviving sons". Ruth appears to have died shortly after her father.

George had moved off of James Island and his family had lost contact with him. Sometime after he married Mary they moved to property which Mary inherited in an area called Pondtown (now Hampton County, SC) along the Salkehatchie River. (e)
