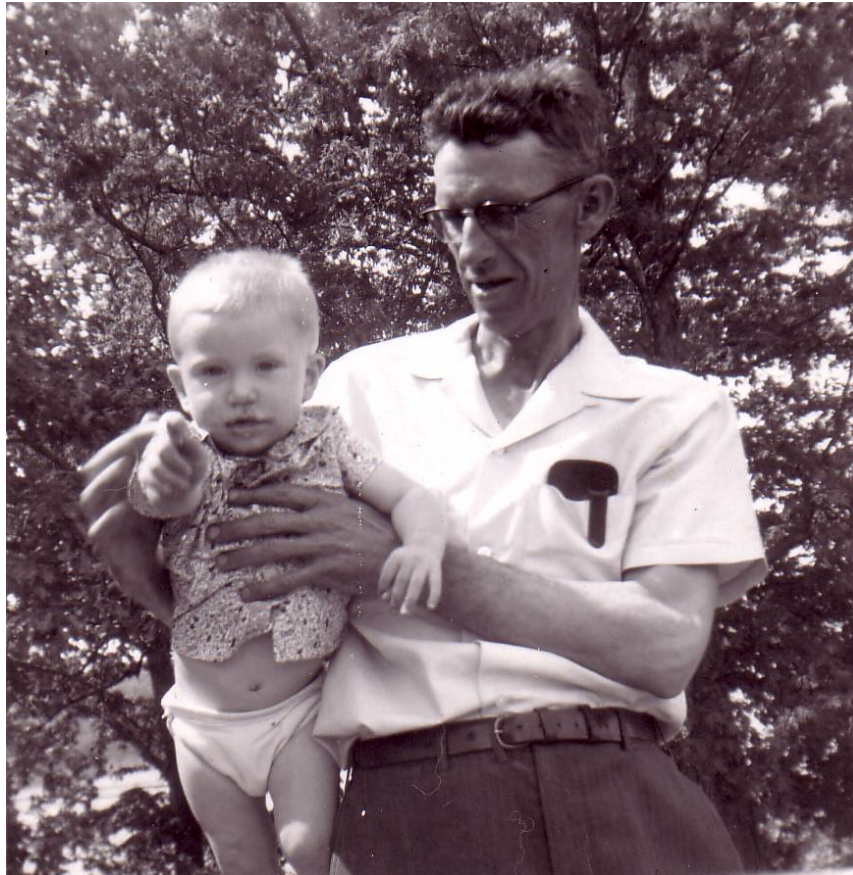

INTERESTING STORY

In 1932, a tornado hit the home of James & Lydia Blizzard. When they heard the storm coming, James wanted to take everyone down to the canning room in their basement. Lydia insisted that there wasn't enough time, so they went to their bedroom with their children.

Lydia, placed Jimmy, the youngest, on the feather bed with her and their daughter Pauline and her older brother, Donald, wrapped their arms around their father's legs, who was standing next to the bed.

After the tornado came through, Lydia and Jimmy were still on the feather bed mattress, but found themselves on the road out in front of their farmhouse. James, along with Pauline and Donald, were thrown out into the front yard. Their house had been totally destroyed, but they were ok.

They then discovered that the canning room had filled up completely with mud. If they had gone there for safety they may not have survived.

James Blizzard worked at the Eastman Plant during this time:

A hallmark in TEC and Kingsport history is the story of the company's contribution to the World War II effort. When the war halted natural rubber supplies from Asia, the Allies developed a commercial method for making synthetic rubber based on a process that depended on hydroquinone. As a result, TEC developed a close relationship with the War Production Board. In 1941 the National Defense Research Committee (NDRC) contacted TEC general manager James C. White and requested the initiation of a pilot plant for the manufacture of the powerful explosive RDX. H. G. "Herb" Stone (1897-1976) led the effort to develop RDX and served as works manager of the Holston Ordnance Works. Soon TEC was manufacturing RDX and Composition B in the large quantities needed to win the war in the European theatre. In early June 1942 TEC received official authorization from the U.S. Army Ordnance and NDRC to design and operate Holston Ordnance Works (HOW). Subsequently, HOW became the world's largest manufacturer of high explosives. Now known as Holston Defense and the Holston Army Ammunition Plant, the company continues to be one of the world's largest manufacturers of explosives. In 1943 TEC and HOW received the prestigious Army-Navy "E" Award for "outstanding achievement in the production of materials of war."

## Flash Flood Leaves Wake Of Damage At Church Hill

**Crops Ruined, Homes Moved As Year's  
Worst Storm Strikes Kingsport Area**

A terrific rain and electrical storm which struck Kingsport late Sunday night apparently was centered in Church Hill and Carter's Valley where damages estimated to run into thousands of dollars was caused when a flash flood swept houses from their foundations, destroyed crops and tore away fences.

Considerable damage also was done by lightning and strong winds.

## Wheeler Tries For 5th Term

**Montana's Sizzling  
Primary Set Today**

Montanans decide today the matter of a fifth term nomination for Democratic Senator Burton K. Wheeler who, in the final days of a sizzling primary campaign, drew support in a letter from President Truman and opposition by James Roosevelt, son of the late President. Wheeler's contest with 40-year-old Lief Erickson, former state supreme court justice, far overshadows in national interest other primary election races this week.

Wyoming, Arizona and Arkansas also are having primary elections today while Georgia, where a torrid race for the Democratic governorship nomination is winding up, votes Wednesday.

### Montana Campaign

In the hot Montana campaign Wheeler had the opposition of at least two labor organizations—the CIO and the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen — and of his colleague Senator James E. Murray (D-Mont.).

Principal Wyoming interest is the race between former Governor Neil H. Smith and State Treasurer Earl Wright for the Republican senatorial nomination. The winner will oppose Senator O'Mahoney, Democrat, who is unopposed for renomination.

In Arizona renomination of Senator McFarland, Reps. Harless and Murdock and Gov. Sidney P. Osborn, all Democrats, is expected by observers.

## Soviet Returns American Couple Held In Berlin

Berlin, Tuesday —P— The Russians early today released two Americans whom they had held 15 days for entering the Soviet zone of occupation without a written permit.

Those released were Warrant Officer Samuel L. Harrison of San Antonio, Tex., and his wife, Helen, who disappeared on July 1 after entering the Soviet zone to visit a pet shop.

They were released as American authorities in Germany appeared to be headed for a showdown in the Harrison's case and that of two officers who have been missing since

Along the road from Kingsport to Church Hill trees were uprooted, signs torn down with considerable wind damage being done in the Mt. Carmel area.

The storm brought with it the heaviest rainfall in the memory of M. L. West, weather observer at the filter plant. With most of the downpour concentrated within 90 minutes time, West reported a total of 3.03 inches of rain fell, the heaviest rainfall, he said, in the 15 years he has been weather observer.

### Service Restored

Kingsport Utilities officials said Monday night power service had been restored to normal in Kingsport while the telephone company was still working to reestablish complete service.

W. S. Argabright, manager of the Inter-Mountain Telephone Company, said about 250 telephones had been returned to service Monday, leaving about 350 still out of order. The original estimate of 500 phones out of order Monday morning was increased to about 600 later in the day, Argabright said.

In Church Hill the home of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Mullins, on the edge of Cooper's Creek, was swept from its foundation and hurled against a bridge on the main highway. The couple and Mrs. Mullins' sister, Mrs. Sarah Bailey, barely escaped injury when they climbed through a window just before the house was moved.

### Wall Of Water

According to several who saw the flood in Church Hill, and as it rushed through Carter's Valley, described it as a wall of rolling, rushing water about eight feet high, tearing down Cooper's Creek.

Hubert Christian, who lives in Carter's Valley about two miles from Church Hill, said he was out in the storm watching after some cattle and said he saw the wall of water which looked like an "ocean."

Mrs. Mullins said the roar of the stream awakened them and when they looked out the water was surrounding the house and was starting into the kitchen. She said all of her furniture was saved except for a kitchen coal range. Only the

wringer to a washing machine had been found late Monday, she said.

Across the stream from the Mullins' home F. R. Jones reported considerable damage to his store, corn mill and residence which occupy the same building. He said the water was 10 inches deep in the mill and estimated his damage at about \$200. The Mullins family was unable to estimate their damage.

In Church Hill the water was estimated to have reached a depth of about 10 feet.

All who saw the flood said that within an hour the creek was back in its banks and only the debris, torn fences and washed-out bridges remained to testify to the fury of the stream.

At Johnson's Store, in Carter's Valley, an automobile belonging to Hansel Pleasant washed downstream about 300 yards and was heavily damaged. The Roby Young home where Pleasant lived, was damaged by the water which rose to a depth of four inches in all the rooms, Young reported.

### Livestock Lost

The only livestock reported lost were five hogs and 40 chickens owned by J. D. Byington near Johnson's Store. Farmers in the valley said it is likely other livestock was lost.

J. C. Blizzard, who has lived in Carter's Valley 28 years, offered an explanation of the flood. He was of the opinion that the heavy rain caused the streams to rise in Lee School and Bradshaw School hollows and the waters from both reached the creek at the same time, causing the wall of water.

At the farm of Floterial Representative Bert Smith, near Church Hill and in the opposite direction from Carter's Valley, lightning struck a large barn which was completely destroyed by the fire that followed.

### Bolt Fell Cow

Bert Smith, Jr., reported that a cow was killed by the bolt and between 800 and 1,000 bushels of orchard grass seed was lost in the blaze.

Monday afternoon a tour of Carter's Valley revealed farmers busy repairing bridges, fences and removing debris.

In Kingsport downtown streets were flooded in several places and Charles Marsh, assistant director of public works, reported the city received about a dozen calls from residents who asked for help in draining their basements.

He also said two trucks were out Monday hauling dirt off of pavements which washed down from unpaved streets.

He also said the city assisted in removing debris from lawns.

The Holston River, as a result of the rain, rose from two to 4.8 feet, but is now gradually receding.

C. C. Baker, county agent, reported some damage to corn, which was blown down, and tobacco, but said that the general damage to crops in the Sullivan County area was slight. He said that the heavy rainfall caused some soil erosion.

An unusual angle to the heavy rain was provided with the report that hundreds of birds had been drowned in the downpour. In one small West View area, 283 dead birds, chiefly sparrows, were counted Monday morning.

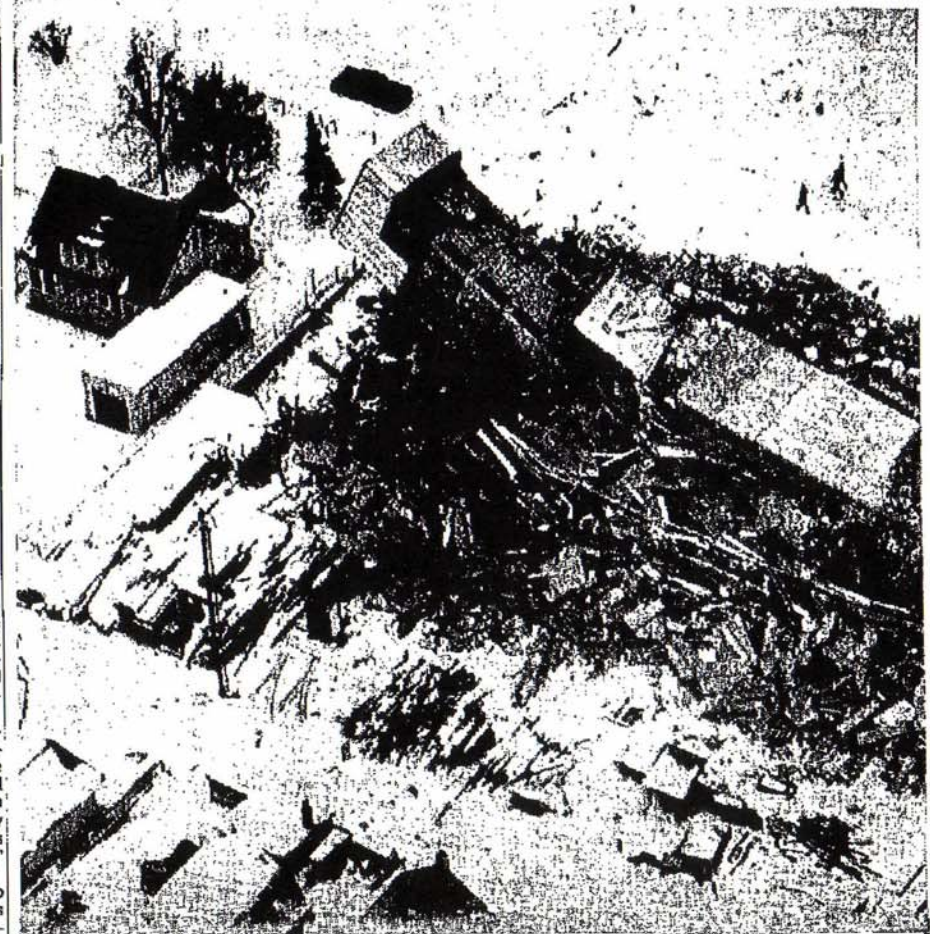
## Hemorrhage

TOKYO (UPI)—U.S. Ambassador Edwin D. Reischauer, the victim of a stabbing attack at the hands of a deranged Japanese youth, Sunday suffered a hemorrhage of the gastrointestinal tract.

Doctors at Toranomon Hospital, where Reischauer was taken after he was stabbed in the right thigh last Tuesday, said the ambassador was given whole blood transfusions. They said the bleeding was serious but that there was "no threat" to Reischauer's life.

"Any time anyone has gastrointestinal tract bleeding, it is serious," said U.S. Navy physician Capt. R. E. Faucett, one of the doctors who examined the ambassador. "But the ambassador's response to treatment has been good and there is no threat to life."

U.S. Embassy spokesman Nathaniel Thayer said the 53-year-old Reischauer had been given glucose and "over a pint of blood" since the bleeding was discovered early Sunday. It was believed to have stopped.
