Obituary

William Harrell was born in North Carolina and in the year 1811 he emigrated from Orange County, north Carolina to Grainger county, Tenn. then settled and became a citizen after which being called upon by his country to perform the diuties of a soldier in the war of 1812 he obeyed and discharged (illegible) duties of a soldier we have no doubt with (illegible) and patriotism becoming a brave son of American freedom peace having been (illegible) and after having served his country to the last and endured all the hardships he received an honorable discharge and made his way on foot from Mobile Ala home in Grainger County, Tenn. after returning home he resumed his farming business and living the life of an honest farmer so long as his physical strength would admit it and not withstanding his old age and inbescitidy (sp) he manifested the most strenuous habits of industry up to the day of his death. on the 16th of June 1859 after having taken a sunny (illegible) dinner at the house of one of his sons and having made some remarks as to his health being better than it had been for some time he returned to his work at the mill after having been heard by one of the Neighbor women to shut down the gate he was in a few minits found dead with his shovel in his hand we feel to sympathise with his bereaved (illegible) children and friends, and consider it a great loss to any church and neighborhood to loose one so worthy would be to heaven that thousands of our fellow men would follow his good example and that we (illegible) be resigned to the will of heaven and (illegible) the dispensations of Providence."
