WILL OF JOSEPH ELIAS BARRON: Circa 1792,

(Joseph Elias Barron relinquished some of his land to his children and the next year he died. Territory south of the Ohio, Washington County)


I, Joseph Barron, being very sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory to God for the same do make and ordain this my last will and testament. First, I give my Soul to God, that gave it me and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner and such worldly goods as it hath been please God to bless me with, I give in the following manner: Item... I give to my beloved wife, Ann Barron, all what the law allows her. I give to my five children, namely John Barron, Joseph Barron, James Barron, William Barron, Henry Barron, the balance of my estate. **My daughter Sarah Dotson**, Mary Ford and Walker Barron, having already had their full share each of them, I give one shilling. Item... I appoint my two sons, Joseph Barron and William Barron, executors and do revoke and disannul all other wills before this made by me. Witness my hand and seal this second day of August, 1793. Wit: John Kincheloe, Margaret (her mark) Barron. The foregoing will was proven in court by the oaths of John Kincheloe and Margaret Barron, the subscribing witnesses thereto at August sessions 1793 and ordered to be recorded. The will is recorded in the County Clerk's office of Washington County, Jonesboro, Tennessee, Volume 1, p. 29 - 30, drawer B.

I then give to my five children namely John Barron
 Joseph Barron William Barron Henry Bar-
 son James Barron the balance of my Estate my
 daughter Sary Dotson Mary Ford and Walker Barron hav-
 ing already had their full share each of them I
 give one shilling

I then I appoint my two sons Joseph Ba^{rron} and
 William Barrons Executors and do ~~not~~ ^{the} and
 deny all other ^{wills} before this made by me Witness my hand
 and seal this second day August 1798
 witness present
