Administration Bond.

SOUTH CAROLINA.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we Anne Mary Orth, Jacob Rydick and Erasmus D. Allin are holden and firmly bound unto Equite ordinary for the district of Bamwell in the full and just sum of Three thousand Dollars lawful money of this state, to be paid to the said Erasmus D. Allin or his successors, ordinaries of this district, or their certain attorney or assigns. To which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, and every of us, our and every of our heirs, executors and administrators, for the whole, and in the whole, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated the thirtieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Ten

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the within above bounden administratrix of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of George De Montague deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of her the said Anne Mary Orth or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the ordinary's office of this district, at or before the thirtieth day of June next ensuing. And the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time hereafter shall come to the hands or possession of the said Anne Mary Orth

and possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly administer according to law. And further, do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of her administration, at or before the thirtieth day of June next, and afterwards when thereunto required. And all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining on the said administration account (the same being first examined and allowed by the ordinary of this district for the time being) shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said ordinary, by his decree or sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of the statutes and acts of assembly, of force in this state, for the better settling of intestates' estates, shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same to the said ordinary, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said Anne Mary Orth

within bounden being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration, approbation of such testament being first had and made, to the said ordinary; then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
