

Spotlight on the Arts

The major project of the Arts Community Service Program is the organization of the annual Yorktown Woman's Club art contest and show for students attending York County Public Schools. Teachers are notified of the contest in the fall and each school may submit six entries in any of 24 categories All participating students will receive a certificate. Students in places 1-4 and Honorable Mention will also receive a ribbon. Students awarded first place in their category are then invited to the Art Show and reception on February 21.

Members of the YWC Art Committee are needed for four activities prior to and including the art show.

- **January 24, 2017** -- Members meet at my house to organize and check each piece of artwork for judging. This is not a difficult task. It is fun to see all of the student art and we do have refreshments! This takes no more than a couple hours.
- **February 6, 2017** Members meet at Yorkminster Presbyterian Church in the morning to set up the artwork for judging. After judging, we separate the first place winners' pieces which will be the artwork actually displayed at the art show.
- **February** 15, 2017 Members meet at my house to attach ribbons to certificates. Artwork that will not be in the show is organized and returned to York SBO.
- **February 21, 2017** THE BIG SHOW!!!!! Committee members meet at York-minster Presbyterian Church in the morning to set up the art for the show. Members of the night division provide a wonderful reception. Students and their families arrive by 6:30. Each student is called forward to receive a certificate and ribbon and four "Best in Show" winners are announced, one in each age/grade group (K-2, 3-5, 6-8, 9-12). Afterwards, everyone enjoys the reception and cleans up.

This is a wonderful project that touches students at all grade levels. It is so rewarding to see the proud students and their families at the show and to recognize the teachers who work so hard. Join us this year and see for yourself!

Art Show General Rules: Crafts and Needlework entries must have been completed during the current year, or since the last club contest in January, 2016.
