Jan 2017 Painting with Light

This is a very popular technique amongst photographers. It is accomplished by using a long exposure in a dark or dimly lit environment with a single moving light source

This is the exciting part of Photography as no two images are identical and each one is a masterpiece. For the beginner it is a very complicated procedure to understand but once mastered it becomes very simple. Use a tripod to avoid movement during the long exposures and a remote shutter release Use manual settings – the auto exposure meter will not work in the dark.

F/8 for 30 sec with an ISO 0f 100 is a good starting point. Manual focus on the stationary light source and set your white balance for the best result

Set saturation to maximum.

Experiment with different Settings to get the best results as it depends on the light source .

Reduce Vibrations

Use a remote shutter release to prevent camera shake when releasing the shutter If you don't have A remote then use the time delay or self timer function to eliminate camera shake.

Choosing the right light source

There are many options available, LED, Head lamps Bicycle lamps, laser lamps Flashlights, glow sticks, sparklers, candles the list is endless limited only by your imagination.

Fireworks produce interesting shots . Use a long exposure let hem dance across your sensor . Use a low ISO and an f top some where between $\frac{1}{2}$ and 30 seconds . Different coloured filters can produce some interesting results.

Wear black or dark coloured clothing so that you don't appear as a ghost in the photo.

In conclusion painting with light can be fun and produce some interesting resultsHave fun and play with the light.
