April 2017 Trailing Stars The night sky will unveil untold treasures That you never though existed. Long exposures make the stars swirl. Bear in mind the stars don't move it is the earth rotating on its axis and traveling around the sun, thus causing the illusion of moving stars. For best success use a a tripod and a remote shutter release to help stabilize the camera during the long exposure. Take several shoots from the same location, Long exposures are extremely hard on batteries always take an extra set. Auto focus does not work in the night sky you must manually focus on a bright object first. Always use manual mode with a large aperture shutter speed 30 seconds and an ISO of 1600, turn the auto noise reduction system off to prevent gaps in the star trails. Stay away from bright city lights, Shoot on a clear night with no cloud cover. Have patience and make it a Memorise night, and have some fun
