





Around the Tables

AROUND THE TABLES, I heard a man say, "There are always going to be people I dislike, and people who dislike me." Silently, I agreed. And then it hit me: Why had I agreed? I had agreed because it was an old idea. If I have learned anything in AA, it is not to accept every old idea as being the truth.

So I thought about likes and dislikes. If I believe in what we learn in AA, then one of two things will happen with each person who has a trait I don't like: Either the person will lose that trait, or I'll stop disliking it after a while. In other words, practicing AA principles always results in change. As long as I am practicing the Steps, change will come about. Disliking people is, therefore, a defect or shortcoming in me, and as I practice Steps Six and Seven, these dislikes will disappear.

As I try to practice these principles, I don't seem to get too negative a reaction from too many people. So after some consideration, I must say that I'm learning to like everybody--slowly but positively. And as I grow to like more people, it seems my life gets better and better. One day at a time, it's an adventure living in AA and learning to let go of yet another old idea. I'll keep trying.
