**Membership**

Any AA group that desires membership is a member of the Siouxland Intergroup.

**Information and Referral:** The Central Office is an information and referral center-- answering over 100 calls per month and personally welcoming drop-in visitors, many of whom are new to the program or out-of-town visitors looking for information or literature.

**AA Twelve Step Calls:** The Central Office has an up-to-date list of AA members available for 12 step calls.

**Speakers:** Central Office maintains a list of speakers available upon request from groups, schools, organizations, or churches.

**Meeting Schedules:** The Central Office publishes A.A. meeting schedules that contain information about the time and location of meetings in the Siouxland area: Northwest Iowa, Northeast Nebraska, and Southeast South Dakota.

**Newsletter:** Intergroup's monthly newsletter, "The Groupline," is now available on our website at [www.aasiouxcity.org](http://www.aasiouxcity.org). Contents of the newsletter include articles by local members, information of AA events, meeting changes and news of General Services.

**Literature:** A complete and up-to-date selection of AA Conference approved literature; "Grapevine" books, magazines, CD's and service material are available

**Temporary Contact Program:** Intergroup works with the committees of Iowa, South Dakota, and Nebraska to find temporary contacts for alcoholics leaving treatment facilities, detox, or correctional facilities.

**Hospitality:** The coffee is always on at the Central Office. Drop in, have a cup, and browse our selection of A.A. literature.

**Phone calls:** Siouxland Intergroup's phone is answered 24 hours a day at (712) 252-1333. The phone is answered by the Central Office staff from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Tuesday through Thursday, and on Friday 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The Central Office is closed Saturday, Sunday & Monday at which time the phone is answered by AA members or AA groups that volunteer their time to answer the phone in shifts. Anyone interested in being a phone volunteer should call the Central Office for more information.

**Intergroup Meetings:** Intergroup meetings are held the third Thursday of every month at 7:00 p.m. at the Central Office. Intergroup Representatives (IGR's) meet with the board to discuss the needs of Intergroup and AA groups. Here, events such as the Hoe-down, Founder's Day, New Year's Celebration and Unity Dinners are planned with the groups participating in the execution of these events. Intergroup's main purpose is to serve the suffering alcoholic through the Central Office that serves as the link between Alcoholics Anonymous and the public.

**Financial support:** Intergroup is supported solely by contributions from the **groups** and from **individual members** through programs like the "Birthday Plan" and the "Faithful Fivers plan". Ask us how you can help.
