-2016 Significant Rule Changes-

Baseball Rule 1.10 - Provides guidance regarding new bat restrictions beginning for the 2018 season for the Junior Division and below.

NOTE: Beginning with the 2018 season, non-wood and laminated bats used in the Little League (league age 12 and below), Intermediate (50-70) Division, and Junior League shall bear the USA Baseball Performance Standard. All BPF-1.15 bats will be prohibited beginning with the 2018 season. Additionally, starting in 2018, the bat diameter shall not exceed 2–5/8 for these divisions of play.

- SB Rule 8.01 Provides additional clarification that a pitcher must come to the pitcher's plate with the hands separated.
- (c) The shoulders shall be in line with first and third bases. When taking the pitching position, the pitcher must have his/her hands separated and must have the ball in either the glove or the pitching hand.
- (d) Prior to pitching, the pitcher shall take a position with his/her pivot in contact with the pitcher's plate. This contact must be on or partially on the top surface of the pitcher's plate. The non-pivot foot must be on or behind the pitcher's plate. (e)While on the pitching plate, the pitcher shall take the signal or appear to be taking a signal with the hands separated. The ball must remain in either the glove or pitching hand.
- (f) After completing (e) above, the pitcher shall bring the hands together in front of the body for not less than one second and not more than 10 seconds before starting the delivery.

BB & SB Rule 4.15(f) and Tournament Chain of Command-Clarifies that an umpire and the Tournament Committee may impose penalties to a coach, manager, or team for making a travesty of a game.

- 4.15 A game may be forfeited by the Umpire-in-Chief of the game in progress to the opposing team when a team-
- (f) employs tactics designed to delay, shorten or make a travesty of the game.

BB & SB Tournament Replacement of Player, Manager or Coach.

Replacement of Player, Manager or Coach - Requires a temporary Tournament coach or manager to be entered on the Eligibility Affidavit.

Exception: If a manager or coach is unable to attend a game for a justifiable reason, a Tournament Director could approve a temporary replacement as outlined in the Little League Tournament Team Eligibility Affidavit. Temporary replacement of a manager or coach must be entered on the Eligibility Affidavit.

BB, SB & C Operating Policies - The Little League Operating Manual content has been condensed and included in the back of the rulebook. It is now referenced as the Little League Operating Policies.

-2016 Clarifications-

BB & SB Regulation VII(a) - Schedules. The schedule of games for the regular season shall be prepared by the BoD of the league and must provide for not less than twelve (12) games per team per regular season against other Little League teams within their respective division, exclusive of playoff and tournament games.

SB Regulation VI(c) and 3.03(c)

(c) a pitcher remaining in the game, but moving to a different position, can return as a pitcher anytime in the remainder of the game, but only once in the same inning as he/she was removed. NOTE: A pitcher,, withdrawn from the game for a substitute offensively or defensively, may not re-enter the game as a pitcher. This applies to continuous batting order.



BB & SB Tournament Eligibility Affidavit A map, signed and dated by the league president and District Administrator, showing the actual boundaries of the league, with locations noted for the residences of the parent or legal guardian (court-appointed) or location of the school for every participant named on the affidavit;

SB Selection of Fields.

The outfield fence must be a minimum of 180 feet and a maximum of 225 feet from home plate.

BB & SB Tournament League Eligibility. The league must be chartered in an age appropriate division(s) for which it wishes to enter a tournament team(s), no later than June 1, 2016.

The league must have scheduled and played, at a minimum, a 12-game (per team) regular season, exclusive of playoffs and tournament games, for each division entering tournament prior to the first game in their respective tournament.+

-2016 Tournament Fees-

Little League Tournament Fee has increased from \$150 to \$200 per team. Tournament fees go directly into a fund that Little League International uses to provide financial support to leagues, starting at the sectional level, for participation at the various levels of tournament play.

-Boundary Map Requirements-

All Little League programs are required to establish a league boundary map with assistance from the district administrator. A boundary map maintains a community environment within the league and parity during the Little League International Tournament. Players in a league must live within that league's geographic boundary. The boundary map must meet the following requirements:

- The map must show the enclosed, contiguous boundary of the league outlined on a map.
- A written description of the boundary must be included with the map.
- The map must be signed and dated by the local league president and district administrator.

Region Office must have a copy of a league's boundary map and constitution.

On-Line Mapping

Little League now has a league and district on-line mapping tool that will help determine which addresses are within which league's boundaries. Available through Little League University.

ASAP Reports

- Effective immediately league safety plans may be submitted on-line.
- All umpires must fill out volunteer forms even if paid.
- Recommend criminal background checks, not just sex registry checks.

Little League University On-Line

- Tool-kit for league presidents.
- Educational modules include:
- a) Operations...a step-by-step guide.
- b) Marketing...help leagues grow; do something different each year
- c) Finances and Fundraising.
- d) T-ball Curriculum...Fundamentals, Fun and Fit.
- e) Coach-pitch Curriculum...on-line videos and practice plans.
- f) Best practice methods for each Little League level.

Little League Research On Parents

- 58% of current Little League parents played Little League, so having good coaches is key to success.
- Millennial parents now often have a lawn mower style of parenting as opposed to Baby Boomers who had a helicopter style of parenting.
- Parents have requested more communication thru social media
- 60% of LL videos were downloaded onto mobile devices last year
- Parents want their kids to enjoy plenty of action and not just standing around which requires a different approach to practices



Little League News

- \$4 million/year now available in Little League grants.
- Medical research confirms that specializing in one sport results in increased injuries and burnout.
- Doctors strongly recommend youth 14 and under play in multiple sports or engage in different types of physical activities that use all parts of the body.

Reviewed Potential Rule Changes

Potential rule changes were discussed at the January District 4 Meeting. WR DAs and ADAs met in Seattle to discuss possible rule changes. Upon completion of all Region Roundtables Little League International will review comments, suggestions and determine which rules to implement.

-League Charter-

All California 4 Little Leagues have completed their 2016 charter applications. Leagues purchasing Little League operating insurances are reminded that coverage starts January 1st, but only after approval of their charter application.

-District 4 Tournament Application-District 4 Tournament Applications for 2016 were handed out at the January District Meeting. Applications were mailed to leagues not represented. Leagues should submit their application no later than the March District 4 Meeting.



-Tax Form 990-

League taxes are due on Tuesday, February 16, 2016. Non-profit organizations are required to use federal tax form 990 for gross receipts. E-Postcard 990-N if under \$50K, 990-EZ with Schedule A if over \$50K, or 990 with Schedule A if over \$1M. The penalties for not filing are astronomical.

The organizational meeting for teenage baseball was held on 2-4-16 with the following results:

Intermediate Baseball

There will be eight Intermediate (50/70) teams that will inter-league during the 2016 season as follows:

Concord Continental--one team with no home games
Antioch--one team
Pinole-Hercules--two teams
Walnut Creek--two teams
CALL/CVLL--two teams

Each team will also inter-district with D53 teams (American Canyon, Benicia and Suisun) with double-headers on Saturdays. The first games are scheduled for Saturday, 3-19-16 and the regular season will end before Memorial Day weekend to allow for make-ups if necessary

Junior Baseball:

There will be seven Junior teams that will inter-league during the 2016 season as follows:

NOLL/SOLL-two teams but with limited participation

Mechanics training to prepare umpires for post-season tournaments, with focus on working with new crew members and 2 & 3 man umpire crews.

Adult Volunteer Umpires

Your league should consider developing a group of volunteers who have a desire to follow the mission of Little League as an All Volunteer Program providing a service to the local community. Your volunteer umpires are just as important as your managers and coaches when it comes to providing a safe and fun environment for players while at the same time being cost effective.

How can you recruit volunteer adult umpires?:

- Recruit umpires at all league events with your UIC in full umpire uniform.
- Ask each team to nominate two adults as volunteer umpires. Each team has 12 or more players so there is a large number of parents who can give back to the League.
- Start small with the commitment, explain that you only need them to do 1 or 2 games a week.
- Contact local high school and college umpire associations and ask their members to donate one or two games a week. Make sure these umpires are trained in Little League rules.
- Contact local police, fire, and military units as their members are community minded and often have flexible schedules.
- Advertise in your local newspapers or other media.
- Find that fan in the stands who (already knows the rules) is always complaining about the umpires. A perfect candidate for your volunteer umpire program.

Remember, recruiting is the first step. Once you have them recruited, remember to train them so they will do well and have fun. Keep them coming out with incentives like post game hot dog and soda, uniforms and equipment. Then, at the end of the season recognize your volunteer umpires when you have your season closing ceremonies, or with a special party.

A successful Volunteer Umpire Program starts with your Board of Directors leadership, and a strong statement that umpires deserve utmost respect and harassment or abuse will not be tolerated.
