The only dirt area of the field is the pitching mound, the rest is turf. Had league presidents introduce themselves, one new president this year – Walnut Creek LL.

- 1. Each year leagues are to submit an ASAP plan. Grand Prize for the National Winner is a set of Musco Lights. This year Liz Berg submitted the winning plan for Concord American LL.
- 2. Manager Phil Raines of Martinez LL Junior Softball team advanced to the Western Region tournament in Tucson Arizona. As a manager Phil has also advanced to the Little League and Senior League Western Region tournaments.
- 3. All leagues completed their Report Card to participate in TOC. I would like for Albany to participate in TOC this season, with their participation all 15 leagues would be represented.

District 4 Budget – was handed out to the league presidents. It shows where funds come from and where they will be spent. Every league should have one. It does not need to be expansive. It can be a pie chart as long as it shows parents where the funds are spent.

Dues - are due in March, they can be paid sooner. Dues for the 2021 season will increase for each All Star team to \$65, this will help to pay for the Appreciation Dinner that was started for umpires and Ted has expanded to include managers and volunteers. A vast majority of volunteers are needed during All Star time.

District 4 Operating Manual – each league president received one. Little League used to send out an Operations Manual to each league, the last year was 2015. In 2016 they added it to the Rule Book – some items are missing. Included in the D4 Operations Manual: history of District 4, State and National levels; bios for D4 staff.

This year (2020) Little League will host the 75th Little League World Series.

Snapshots of leagues – were handed out to each league. They show how each league has increased or decreased from 2007 to present. The data used was from the Data Center. The numbers are in teams based on 12 players per team. Last year D4 lost 35 baseball teams, went from 560 teams to 525, 5 leagues had an increase.

Red – indicates your league at its lowest participation

Green – indicates your league's most participation since 2007; 2014 – Baseball had its highest participation

Yellow – league has the same number of teams as the year before; the number in (..) indicates where your league placed in the district with the amount of teams

The second page represents Softball – it is not as bleak as baseball; last year softball lost 1 team, 84 to 83; 2007 wa the lowest year with 56 teams

Challenge this year is to increase by 5%, that is approximately 300 more players across the district. I would like to do something for those leagues who increase by 5%.

Blue Sombrero – when you enter a player or volunteer the information goes straight to the Data Center, you need only to enter the information once.

Assistant District Administrator. Geoff Shiu:

- My thanks for all the leagues and presidents for hosting games; those who attended the Tournament Directors, Manager/Coaches respective meetings. I saw some good things at the games. The Dress Code was outstanding this past year.
- Post Season Umpires a lot of leagues stepped up, not all leagues provided umpires. All games were covered, no
 phone calls were needed.

Don Waddell and the D4 Umpire staff will provide training here in the district. The trainings will be like those at Western Region headquarters in San Bernardino, League Umpire-in-Chief/Umpire Coordinator should be trained to work with your umpires.

Scholarships - District 4 has two scholarships for attending training in San Bernardino for two different league volunteers for a weeklong training, enough to cover room & board, training and materials. The scholarships will go to the first two who volunteer themselves.

UIC training is November 1-3, Friday – Sunday Clinic = \$90
