-Northern California State Meeting-

California District 4 hosted the 2017 Northern California State Meeting on Saturday, October 1, 2016 at the Willow Pass Community Center, in Concord. Ted Boet led the meeting with special guests from headquarters. Sara Thompson, Softball Director, from Little League International Headquarters in South Williamsport, Pennsylvania and Mark Bernstein, Chief Umpire, from Western Region Headquarters in San Bernardino, California. A very successful meeting with breakout sessions for district chief umpires and a opportunity to hear from Headquarters on their recent adjustments to player age levels.

-League Charter-

As in past years local leagues must complete their annual charter application by logging into the Little League Data Center. Enter your league's ID Number and the chartering process will remain virtually the same as in past seasons. A charter application has been specifically created for each league, along with the related insurance information. All of the charter and insurance fees may also be processed online. Charter applications should be completed in November but no later than December 23, 2016 to receive gratis league operating materials.

-Volunteer Appreciation Dinner-

The 2016 Annual California 4 Volunteer Appreciation Dinner was held Saturday, October 1, 2016 at the Back Forty Texas BBQ Restaurant in Pleasant Hill. Ted Boet and Don Waddell had invited District 4 Staff, League Chief Umpires, California 4 Umpire Association Training Staff, leagues that went above and beyond in post season hosting, and distinguished guests, Sara Thompson, Softball Administrator, International Headquarters, and Mark Bernstein, Chief Umpire, Western Region Headquarters.

-Contact Information-

-Combined Teams Request-

Not enough players to form a team....or enough teams for a division? Consider submitting a Combined Teams form. This form is used by leagues in which there are not enough players to field a team or when there are enough players to field one team, but not enough for two. In either case, two or more leagues could use an approved Combined Teams Request Form to pool their players, and select the teams from among all players in the pool. The leagues could also request permission to allow a combined team for Tournament Play.

A League Chief Umpire organizational meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 15, 2016, UC Extension, 2nd Floor, 75 Santa Barbara Road, Pleasant Hill. It is highly recommended that all local leagues have a volunteer umpire on their local Board...typically the League Chief Umpire in a voting position. League presidents should make sure their league is represented at this very important meeting.

-District 4 Umpire Training-

The C4UA Training Staff will once again offer several events to help leagues meet their needs for rules and umpire mechanics training. Please contact Don Waddell if a local league would like to host a Rules or Field Clinic in 2017

Outreach Mechanics Clinics: 6-8 hour sessions held on a Saturday or Sunday in mid February and early March. Two lined 60' fields, water, and lunch. Clinics will be held in different areas of District 4 and opened to neighboring leagues.

Rules Clinics: Two, 3 hour, classroom sessions are tentatively scheduled for February 8th and 15th, 2017. One will be held in the western part of the district and the other in the eastern part. Rules clinics require a classroom type setting for approximately 100 people. Basic Baseball and Softball rules will be covered.

-UIC Training The Trainer-

Provides information and tools on how to train your volunteers to train any level of Little League umpiring.

-Rules Instruction I-

Power Point presentation open to anyone who desires more comprehensive knowledge of Little League Rules and Regulations. January 20-23, 2017.

-Rules Instruction II-

A combination of Power Point and real game scenarios for the more advanced Little League volunteer umpire. Saturday, comprehensive rules review for both Baseball and Softball. Sunday, interactive discussion about real game situations. January 28-29, 2017.

-Umpire Mechanics Clinic-

Emphasis on field experience and umpiring philosophy for local leagues as well as District umpires. Base and plate mechanics will be taught with eye towards attendees learning new skills, removing some of the rust, and bringing training information back to the leagues and Districts. January 27-29, 2017.

-Adult Umpire Academy-

Academy is designed for the volunteer Little League umpire at all levels. A week of extensive classroom and on field training of rules, mechanics, umpiring philosophy and game management. Students are strongly urged to dress as umpires. February 11-17, 2017.
