Epiphany is on January 6. Epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" and is often called the Gentile Christmas because this is the celebration of when the Magi, who were Gentiles, came to worship Jesus. The Epiphany season continues until the day before Ash Wednesday. The color for most of the season of Epiphany is green. White is used on the Day of Epiphany, on the first Sunday after January 6 when we celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord, and on the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday when we celebrate the Festival of the Transfiguration.

Pastor's Point

Happy New Year everyone and welcome to 2016! I am fairly confident that this will be the year Joy finds and calls its next pastor to guide our mission in Palm Bay for Christ.

If you remember, I came to Joy Church in January of 2015 as interim pastor, but my tenure here was uncertain. No one was able to ascertain at that point if Pastor Werner would be able to return to her call here at Joy. So for the first 4 and ½ months we waited. I think we did some good things during that time, however - mostly in addressing physical and property issues. We also got some committee structures reorganized and working again.

When word finally came that Pastor Werner would not return, we then knew that Joy needed to go through the complete Call Process and accomplish those activities and actions delineated in the Transition Checklist to call a new pastor. However, at the same time we did continue to address physical things at the church and also continued to work on our internal structures. I'm very pleased with the work of the Altar Guild, Fellowship Team, Property Team, Worship and Music Team and Church Council. A Finance group came together late this year and I hope they can be the start of a Finance Team in 2016. I know that issues still exist and all these teams will need additional work and guiding, but that is always the case in any church. I am VERY appreciative of those who participate and work to make Joy Church a great place.

I think we have made some major improvements to the property in 2015. They include: cleaning up and planting new material around the church and Remembrance Garden; lighting the cross in the Remembrance Garden; addressing the electrical wiring of the church lights and putting the fixtures on dimmers; installing LED light bulbs in the sanctuary; putting up a new video projector in the sanctuary; installing all new lighting fixtures in the church parking lot; installing new carpeting in the chancel area; lowering the communion rail; installing new lighting in the Wollam-Jackson room; cleaning up the church sacristy; moving the mail boxes out of the nursery and resurfacing the portico roof. Much of this was accomplished by the able men (and some women too) of Joy Church. Next on my list for 2016 is addressing the church office and turning it into a proper workspace. But for all that was accomplished in 2015 - thank you!

I think the spiritual dynamic of Joy Church is fairly good now in that I see no major conflicts or indications of serious internal problems. We are emotionally ready for new leadership, I think. Our average worship attendance has stabilized around 100 and our stewardship campaign for 2016 was quite successful. We did pretty well financially for the year - just missing the General Fund budget by about two thousand and the Mortgage Fund by just a few hundred. I think the proposed budget that you will see prior to the Annual Meeting on January 31 is well within our reach. We have some money in the bank - enough so we don't have to struggle to pay bills every month - and I feel we should be financially stable in 2016. However, this does not discount our need to increase giving in the future in that full time pastors are expensive.

In 2016, I think it will also be important for Joy to hire an outside, paid Office Secretary and, while I am pleased with the music right now, I do think Joy will want to hire a church musician/organist some time in this new year as well.

²⁰ As it is, there are many members, yet one body. ²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ²² On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable," (1 Cor. 12:20-22)

Faith without Works Is Dead

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? ¹⁷ So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

¹⁸ But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith. ¹⁹ You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe—and shudder. ²⁰ Do you want to be shown, you senseless person, that faith apart from works is barren? ²¹ Was not our ancestor Abraham justified by works when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? ²² You see that faith was active along with his works, and faith was brought to completion by the works. ²³ Thus the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness," and he was called the friend of God. ²⁴ You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone. ²⁵ Likewise, was not Rahab the prostitute also justified by works when she welcomed the messengers and sent them out by another road? ²⁶ For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead. (James 2:14-26 NRSV)

A Christian worked each day transporting tourists across a lake. On occasions he would present the Gospel and its implications for life in an unusual way. He had painted the word "Faith" on one of the oars of his rowboat and "Works" on the other. When they got rather far from shore, he would stop, and beginning to row with only the one oar marked "Faith," he would cause the boat to go in circles to the left. Reversing the process, he would pull on the other oar marked "Works," and they would circle in the opposite direction. By this time the bewildered passengers were waiting for an explanation. This afforded him an opportunity to give the truth concerning discipleship. He always concluded by saying, "You see, neither faith nor works can stand alone. They are twins that cannot be separated!"

Blessings and Peace to all from the Pilgrim Journey Band.


