LENT

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.



Ash Wednesday officially begins the season of Lent; it ends at the Easter Vigil.

What is important about Lent is to fully enter into the penitential tone of the season and to be prepared for Easter.

Pastor's Point

By the time you are reading this, Joy will have conducted its Annual Congregational meeting to review the year of 2015, to approve/change and adopt a 2016 fiscal mission budget and to elect council members and congregational officers for 2016. I am very grateful for those who served on Church Council in 2015 and appreciative of their work. Likewise, I am also thankful and appreciative of those who have consented to serve the congregation in leadership position for 2016. Willingness of Joy people to serve is a good sign and I am looking forward to working with the leadership at Joy in this New Year when we, God willing, will identify and call a new pastor to Joy.

I am very pleased with the progress we have made together at Joy Lutheran during this interim year in which we have been together. Rather than review what I have already stated in the 2015 Annual Report, suffice it to say that a number of significant changes have been made, numerous property improvement have been accomplished, new ministry structures have begun to emerge, there is a little monetary cushion in the bank and the state of the congregation is healthy and positive. I see no major issues remaining that would prevent Joy for moving ahead to form a Call Committee and move ahead with the call process. There are a few remaining items on the Transition Checklist that will need to be accomplished prior to the formation of a Call Committee, but I see that being complete by the end of February.

The one possible concern I have for the call of a new pastor is compensation. While the 2016 budget provides for a new pastoral package in the last half of 2016 that is about 11% higher than what was paid the previous full time pastor on an annual basis, Joy will still have to grow to meet its financial needs in 2017 and beyond. Therefore I will continue to concentrate on new membership - even during this interim time - for if Joy is able to grow now; it can certainly grow under the leadership of a new full time pastor. However, the budget for 2016 is only a modest increase over our actual receipts for 2015 and therefore I feel very comfortable that Joy Church can meet its fiscal goals in the year to come.

In addition to growth, I will also focus on our Core Values which we determined at our Living Lutheran Retreat on January 9. Now that we know what Joy is about, we should plan to consciously incorporate them into all existing and new ministries at Joy.

Thank you all for a good year together. I look forward to what the Lord will do at Joy in the year to come.

STEWARDSHIP IN ACTION

Q: I've heard I can donate my MRD directly to a charity? Is that true?

A: Yes; It has taken almost a full year – literally – but Congress finally passed an appropriations act, which included the much anticipated extenders bill. However, this isn't your run-of-the-mill extenders bill. This year's version of the extenders bill permanently extends the QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) provision that allows; IRA owners age 70½ or older to donate up to \$100,000 from their traditional IRA directly to a qualified charity and have it count toward their minimum required distribution (MRD).

An important tax note: The MRD amount you donate directly to charity is not tax deductible. Instead, you don't have to include it in your taxable income, as you typically do with an MRD. That is the tax benefit.

For tax year 2016, MRDs must be donated by December 31, 2016, to count toward a 2016 MRD. To do this, talk to your financial advisor/institution. The check must be made out to the charity (i.e. Joy Lutheran Church) by your financial institution. Then, they can send you the check to present to the charity or they can mail it directly to the charity.

Winning: Donors who take advantage of the IRA charitable rollover provision can win by:

- Reducing assets in their IRA accounts that can be highly taxed at death.
- Making meaningful—including larger—outright gifts to their favorite charities.
- Seeing their gifts impact their charities' mission and results now.
- Knowing that IRA charitable rollovers will qualify—in part or in whole—for the yearly required minimum distributions for persons age 70½ and older.
- Understanding that, while IRA owners cannot take an income tax deduction for this transfer, neither will they have to realize it as taxable income.

Check with your financial advisor to take advantage of the IRA charitable rollover provision.
