Pastor's Point

May - a Significant Month of Christian Meaning

I was looking at the church calendar for May and was struck at how full (liturgically speaking) it was. The Day of Ascension, Pentecost, Holy Trinity and the Visitation are the major ones. But there are other things I'd like to mention and comment on too, so here we go.

May 1st is Rachael's Day at Joy. Rachael's Day began in 1996 because of the plight of inner city kids. While more grandly observed in the past at Joy, this year we still are using it as an occasion to assist abused, neglected and abandoned kids at Nana's House. Joy's outreach to our local community is one of our strengths and core values. You will have an opportunity to help in the effort by making a contribution.

May 8th is Mother's Day. I know that Mother's Day is not officially "observed" in the church year and that is correct, but to ignore it as we worship on the Sunday of Mother's Day is, in my opinion, a big mistake. Mother's Day got its start in the church as a way of thanking God for the gift of saintly mothers. We will observe our mother's at Joy in a special way on May 8th. I for one am glad that my mother of 98 years is still around. In fact, she will be at Joy on May 8th along with my sister and daughter - both also mothers.

May 15th is the Day of Pentecost - the birthday of the Christian Church and the day the Holy Spirit came to the Christian community in power. I hope you will remember to wear BRIGHT RED on the Day of Pentecost at Joy. It is a reminder that the Holy Spirit is just alive and active among the church today as it was on the first Pentecost. It is up to us to use the energy of God's Spirit to drive the mission of the church (including Joy Church) today.

May 22nd is the principal festival of Holy Trinity. With the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, the Godhead is now complete in Father (the Creator), the Son (the Redeemer) and the Holy Spirit (the Sanctifier). I know that Trinity is not a biblical word - rather a teaching of the church that attempts to explain the mystery of one God in three persons. But many of the things of God are part of a wonderful mystery which will be revealed to us in due time. In the meantime, we trust God and affirm the wondrous mystery of his love and power.

May 29th is the "regular" Sunday in the church year, but it is one at Joy where we will remember those members of our armed forces that gave the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom in that Memorial Day is observed on Monday the 30th.

So there you have it. May - a month full of Christian meaning. I hope you are in church together with the people of God at Joy to celebrate and affirm it!

President Harry S. Truman led the effort to establish a single holiday for citizens to come together and thank our military members for their patriotic service in support of our country.

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force Days.

The single day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense.

Armed Forces Day "**May 21, 2016**" is an opportunity for us to recognize all of our veterans who have faithfully served our country.

A special thank you goes out to our very own "WWII Veteran", Luther Radway.





Luther Radway left his home in Jamaica in 1944 to live with relatives in New York City. Six (6) weeks after his arrival, he was conscripted for military service in World War II. He trained at Fort Lewis, Washington for fifteen weeks, and then at Fort Jackson in South Carolina for an additional six weeks. He was then sent to join the forces in the European Theatre of Operations (ETO). Luther was assigned to the Third Army, as a Combat Engineer, located in Bremen, Germany. His outfit was sent to the combat zone in Elman, Germany to build an airstrip. Fortunately, the war was over within three months following his assignment.

His "high point" was having been honorably discharged with a letter of appreciation and thanks from President Truman, and the recipient of the Ruptured Duck (Honorable Discharge Lapel Pin) awarded to honorably discharged WWII veterans.

His "low point" was having served in a segregated army.

Black Americans have been the victims of racial oppression, but have always supported the nation, especially during wartime. When World War II erupted, over 2.5 million black men registered for the draft and one million served as draftees or volunteers in all of the branches of the Armed Forces during conflict. Most black men who served were in the Army and were relegated to segregated combat support groups.

Thank you Luther, for your patriotic service.

National Day of Prayer May 5th, 2016

In 1775 the Continental Congress allocated a time for prayer in forming a new nation. Over the years, there have been calls for a day of prayer, including from President Abraham Lincoln in 1863. On April 17, 1952, President Harry Truman signed a bill proclaiming the National Day of Prayer into law in the United States. President Reagan amended the law in 1988, designating the first Thursday of May each year as the National Day of Prayer.
