A New Church Year Begins



On the 2nd Sunday in Advent, December 4, our service liturgy will change to the St. James Christmas Mass. It is a liturgy set to the tune of Christmas carols. We will be using this liturgy through the season of Christmas.

Pastor's Point

Sunday, November 27, begins the season of Advent, a time of preparation and a time of great expectation and great anticipation. But exactly what is it that we anticipate? What are we getting ready for? What do we expect to happen? Do we anticipate the end of the world, as some religious cults always do at this time of the year? Are we preparing our hearts and spirits to receive again the coming the coming of the Christ child into the world? Or are we preparing for yet another month-long shopping spree that some have called "economic first-degree murder" – willfully and with malice aforethought murdering our bank accounts? Or maybe we're getting ready for the seven to ten pounds the average American will gain during the season (Lord, please let me be an underachiever this year!)? Or are we preparing for the suicidal traffic jams at Melbourne Square and the general atmosphere of surliness – or as Larry the Cable Guy would say: "Get er done?"

Are we getting ready for the depression, the anxiety, and even the anger that sometimes accompanies the secular holiday season? If we allow ourselves to get caught up in the consumer Christmas – and I firmly believe that we in America celebrate two separate events on December 25 – we can easily find that instead of preparing to sing "O Holy Night" we will find ourselves living out one holy nightmare.

For the many who faithfully observe the consumer Christmas, Advent is the inevitable prelude to disappointment. For the majority of these folks, Christmas somehow hardly ever measures up to their fantasies. Even for those who manage to have some of their Christmas wishes fulfilled, the season is over so quickly that they need to make New Year's to make up for the excesses of the season.

But the Advent we celebrate in the church – the one that has nothing at all to do with the number of shopping days left until Xmas – is altogether different. The hanging of the greens, the placement of the poinsettias, the lighting of the first Advent candle – all these invite us to dream dreams of a better world, to allow expectant visions that have nothing to do with sugar-plum fairies to dance in our heads. Advent invites us to fill the cup of today with a full measure of tomorrow. 2017 should be an exciting and interesting year at Joy. I look forward with Advent anticipation, to what God is going to do here.



These theses were a list of statements that expressed Luther's concerns about certain Church practices - largely the sale of indulgences, but they were based on Luther's deeper concerns with Church doctrine.

Call Committee Corner

The Joy Call Committee has met four times since October 2, 2016. The committee meets on Sunday immediately following the service.

As part of our initial meeting the committee began to read about and understand the basics of Discernment – Discerning God's Will using a series of five devotions from the Book of Acts. Committee members acknowledged that they are seeking to know God's will for the future mission and ministry.

The first order of business was to review the Guide to the MSP (Ministry Site Profile) which is the document that is designed to stimulate reflection, to be a summary of the characteristics and ministry of our church and to serve as the first impression that we wish to give prospective candidates. From that an initial task list was developed.

The first task was to survey the congregation about the <u>Top Five Ministry Tasks</u> and <u>Gifts for Ministry</u> that the congregation felt we wanted and expected in our next pastor. Survey Monkey – an electronic survey instrument – was used to email the survey to members who had an email address on file with the church office. Paper surveys were mailed to members without an email address on file and additional paper surveys were available in the Narthex following the Sunday services. The survey will close out on Sunday, 11/20 and the results will be tabulated and shared with the congregation early in December.

The Call Committee will meet next on Sunday 12/4/16 to begin to review the narrative sections of the MSP using data collected during Cottage meetings, the Retreat and the demographic and trend reports.

Six women from Joy joined about 240 women, for the Florida Bahamas Synodical Women's Organization's Fall Gathering Nov. 11-13. Linda Kratzer's granddaughter was a youth who joined with the 12 other youth for special activities but also together with the rest of us for much of the time. The theme to Love and Serve the Lord was emphasized in our shared ministry with other Lutheran bodies around the world. The Glocal Team of the ELCA, a diverse group of musicians, led us in singing in other languages as well as English throughout the weekend. They provided music for services and presented a workshop. Sunitha Mortha from India led the Bible Study and preached. Pastor Joanie Holden preached twice amazing us with her Spirit-filled delivery without notes. Sister Michele Collins led a Bible reflection. Two Lutheran women from Surinam shared their ministries in one of many workshops. Pastor Lynn led three workshops and Elaine Heine one. Each conference made a display about one of our companion churches in Haiti, Guyana, Surinam, Cuba, and the Bahamas including food. Our Space Coast Conference featured the seminary in Jamaica that trains Anglican, Lutheran, and Methodists pastors in the Caribbean. 
Eternal Candle
