Some thoughts on 2017 at Joy.

I'm writing this after the Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 29. It was a good meeting. After a productive year as attested by the Ministry Team reports, the congregation received the Annual Report as good news and evidence of excellent progress in 2016. Joy's financial stewardship was quite remarkable in 2016 exceeding planned General Fund income by 10%. We welcomed to the ministry staff a part time paid secretary and a new church musician. We had the church painted at minimal cost and we obtained an amazing new Alhborn Galanti organ at minimal cost to the church. The church is close to full most Sunday mornings. The fellowship is joyous - as it should be! The spirit and mood of the congregation is positive and forward looking. Joy has been blessed. We had a good year.

As I mentioned to the Church Council at its January meeting and at the Annual Congregational meeting, I feel my job at Joy is basically done. The five developmental tasks with which I am charged as an interim pastor have pretty much been accomplished. We've put the past in the past and are ready to move on. In the "Living Lutheran Retreat", we identified our core values in terms of who we are and the dynamics that drive our congregation's life together. We certainly have embraced new congregational leadership. I mean, just look at the newly elected Council members! Our relationship with the Florida Synod is much improved evidenced by our mission support giving. Joy is no longer in a position to have to "take what's convenient or available." Joy can attract and support an excellent new pastoral leader. Finally, we are ready for someone new to come and lead Joy Church on to its next chapter in mission in Palm Bay.

So, with that behind us, we need to be thinking of how we use our remaining time together productively. (That means you and your interim pastor.) David Meisenheimer, the pastor of the huge Christ Lutheran Church in Charlotte, NC when I was in that Synod told me once: when you are pushing a rock up a hill, that last thing you want to do is stop to rest. If you knew all the David did when he was pastor at Christ - he was true to that!

So, as we look forward to the Call Committee completing the Mission Site Profile and interviewing candidates for the pastoral position at Joy, I think I will keep on identifying and suggesting things that we can do to make Joy more ready for mission when the new pastor comes. At this point, I think it's all gravy. I mean, there is nothing wrong with Joy advancing before the new pastor comes. Not with major initiatives, of course, but in things that are faithful to the great commission to bring people into relationship with Christ through Joy Lutheran Church. We'll keep each other posted along the way.

#### NEW ORGAN AND ORGANIST



Our organist, Steve Weiss, is very familiar with our newly acquired Alhborn Gananti AG3200 organ. You could say that it followed him from Lutheran Church of the Redeemer from where we acquired it, using our Memorial Funds. This amazing instrument is an outstanding upgrade from our current organ, which we have had since 1988 and is of limited capability. Our "new" AG3200 is truly an organ for the future at Joy. It literally has over 10 times the sounds and capabilities of our older organ. Wait until you hear it!

#### STEVE WEISS:

I and my family were part of the original members of Joy in the 1980s. I was one of the original musicians playing the keyboard and helped during the period of building the current church building and setting up the original sound system. Upon graduating high school I attended Concordia University, River Forest, IL, where I received a BA with three majors, two in computer science and one in church music. My primary instrument was the organ with the minor instrument of strings but I also studied and played all instruments, had a pipe organ design and registration class, choir and orchestra conducting as well as music composition. Upon completion of college I returned to Palm Bay and was the organist and choir director at Joy until approximately 2000. During my time at Joy I directed the choir which included several cantata's featuring local high school musicians, selected the Galanti organ that is/was still in the church as well as other routine music director responsibilities. Upon leaving Joy I became the music specialist at Redeemer Lutheran in Melbourne, FL and have been responsible for weekly services playing the organ and directing the choir and tone chime choir and selecting the hymns and service setting when needed. I have previously been a member, and served as vice-president of the local American Guild of Organist (AGO) chapter. Steve Weiss
