


Sign-up sheet and envelopes are in the narthex. Cost is \$8 per plant.

Pastor's Message

Advent is a season of the church year that churches, like Joy, can relate to. Just as ancient Israel was looking and waiting for a long time for God to send someone to deliver them, so churches between called pastors are waiting for someone to come. Who will it be that God will send and when will he or she get here? I've personally been involved in this process and time of waiting with four different churches as an interim pastor. In every case, the time of waiting has been much longer than expected or desired. Some of that has to do with the transition process, I guess. The Synod wants to have certain things in order before a new pastor arrives in a new location, and it's during a time of transition that they have the leverage to make sure it's done. That's smart thinking and sure helps out the new pastor. Anyway, just as Advent is a season of preparation to receive One who is to come, so the interim period is a time for Joy Lutheran to prepare for someone who is to come.

Lately, I've been pretty encouraged that Joy is making progress along those lines. Attendance has been hovering around 100 per Sunday - sometimes a bit less and sometimes a bit more, but the church feels full and vibrant to me. We made progress in stewardship in November and we are at this point only 3% behind in the General Fund giving for the year and only 2% behind in giving to the Mortgage Fund. Hopefully we will have a good December and we may have a chance at meeting our budget needs for the year. That would be significant.


This leads me to hope that we can increase our budget for 2016 to the point where funding a new called pastor is not in doubt. It's really not that much of a stretch from where we are now. Perhaps only another \$10,000. That would be a huge plus for Joy and signal to the Synod that we are ready and able for someone to come.

I am sure that a Call Committee will form early in the new year, but in the meantime there is ONE MAJOR TASK that Joy must accomplish. The Florida Synod requires that we have a mission related event/retreat for the entire congregation prior to the forming of a Call Committee. This event is based on the book "Living Lutheran" by Dave Daubert. Joy has scheduled this event for the Saturday of January 9, 2016 from 9am until 3pm. It is vital that as many members as possible participate in this event for it will determine our **Purpose and Guiding Principles** for the foreseeable future. This is extremely important for us and for the new pastor who will be called.

So, just as we prepare during Advent to receive the One who comes at Christmas, so must we prepare in this time of transition for the one spiritual shepherd who will come to lead Joy Church. Your input to guide him or her and this church in the future is vital. Please make plans to attend this most important event in the life and future of Joy Church. There is no cost and lunch will be provided. Sign up at church any Sunday.

Oh yeah, did I mention the wonderful food and fellowship? This is an annual retreat and I hope that even more women will be able to join us next year! In support of the selected ministry, Joy women were able to complete and deliver 41 quilts for the abused children that are being treated at the Lake Sumter Children's Advocacy Center.

Then next delivery of the items that our circles make will be the Veteran's Blankets for the Veteran's Home and the home made stuffed animals for the Ronald McDonald house and Bogy Creek children's home on the second Sunday of December.




Greetings all!
