<u>Nut Company</u> Building Update

<u>B</u>uilt in an Art Deco style in 1933, the building at 4227 W. Vliet was originally a corner grocery store at the end of the street car line, and across from the Washington Park Zoo. Tiled in terrazzo floors with striking glossy black tile above the windows, the building later housed the Milwaukee Nut Company, providing roasted nuts, especially seasonal holiday favorites, with a comforting aroma for the neighborhood. Standing vacant with the had a shiny brand new "grill on wheels set" complete with barbecue tools and charcoal. The shop is well organized and the stock includes a large selection of new t-shirts, used books and records, beautiful pottery, craft supplies and dishes. Come on over and check it out! Donations are also very welcome.

shortened name "the Nut Company" neighbors have appreciated the changes since the building was purchased in 2018 by Tom Schuler. Plantings along the 43rd Street side of the building along with painting spruced up the façade, and the property to the west has been cleared of debris. Tom has experience restoring buildings in Milwaukee, and has a vision to restore the beauty of the windows. He would like to create a small production site, including a retail space. Walking with the Alderman & Mayor

Over 50 neighbors joined the neighborhood walk on Tues., August 20, as Alderman Murphy's annual walk was combined with Mayor Barrett's "100 Miles in 100 Days" neighborhood walking program. Neighbors provided ideas for the walk, and the **MDNA** Coordinating Committee designed a one hour walk route that showcased concerns, improvements, and homes full of pride. Beginning at 2 Mesa restaurant the Alderman and the Mayor warmly greeted neighbors, commending the dedication and inspiration that keeps Martin Drive flourishing as a community. Joining the walk were City of Milwaukee staff from the departments of Forestry, Building Inspection, Public Works and Planning, and Police who recorded neighbor concerns and ideas for solutions. A diverse group of neighbors warmly greeted each other.

The intersection of Martin Drive and Highland, with no, or rolling stops by drivers; and the intersection of Juneau and Martin Drive, with the recessed and not always used stop sign, were both noted as needing clearer signage to reduce the safety concerns of pedestrians and traffic. A new section of fencing and stonework repairs on the west side of Martin Drive were commended, with neighbors indicating that broken down structures really sent the wrong message to both residents and visitors to the neighborhood. Numerous gardens and well kept homes were noted on the west side of Martin Drive, and visible down 43th and 44th streets, as the walk headed to 45th and 46th and Martin. Both corners are known for speedy traffic off and onto the expressway. A concern all along the walk were needed sidewalk repairs. It was noted that

The 26th Annual "Spooktacular" is on Friday, October 25th – 7:30 pm to 8:30 pm

Here Is What You Need to Know:

1. Each year designated blocks are selected as the treating home area. Promptly at 7:15 pm, security monitors put up barricades so that everyone is free to roam the area, crossing streets safely. To create this safe environment, we enlist the volunteer help of teen and adult neighbors.

2. This event is for neighborhood children and grandchildren under the age of 13 only. Teens in costume are welcome to help in monitoring streets. All children must be accompanied by an adult both at registration and the night of trick-or-treating.

3. All children must be registered to participate, and families are asked to contribute \$1 per registered child, and a bag of candy (200 pieces or more). If more than 4 children are registered, families are asked to contribute 2 bags of candy. Registered children will receive a special trick or treat bag which identifies children as being registered. Families are notified at registration time of the treating area.
