In September, several meetings were held with landlords and investors. The goal is to create a network of support and resources to one another and improve their investment while creating a stronger quality of life within the neighborhood. Targeted Investment Neighborhood or TIN

Martin Drive is applying to be a TIN neighborhood. A TIN is a City of Milwaukee program set up to stabilize and improve neighborhoods. TINs use strategies to strengthen property values, stabilize and increase owner-occupancy, improve overall physical appearance and enhance quality of life. There are many advantages including that homeowners are eligible for \$15,000 forgivable loans. The program priorities include, exterior code-related repairs such as roofing, siding, porch repairs, lead abatement including replacement windows, energy conservation, plumbing, electrical, heating. There would also be money available for Community Improvement Projects in the neighborhood. <>

Guess Who's Coming To Dinner? - Please inform your guests that doorbells and phones are to be used to pre-announce their presence. Car horns and yelling to announce arrival is not enjoyable to neighbors.

Kids R US - Please observe the 11 pm summer and 10 pm school year curfew & remind your children not to cut through neighbors' yards.

Keep It Clean - Garbage carts need to be removed promptly from the curb after pick-up. Picking up trash from your yard whenever you see it will keep our neighborhood looking good.

Graffiti Busters - Please report graffiti to your landlord right away so that it can be removed quickly. If you're a homeowner, please remove it as soon as possible.

Wrong Way on a One-Way – Going the wrong way on a one-way street is dangerous and unnecessary. Cars pulling out and kids playing don't expect it.

Park It - Remember to observe the posted street parking regulations. Parking on unpaved areas (grass) is not permitted by code.
