Mr. Alex Autry is with the Department of the Air Force at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. He is Assistant Director and Chief of Instructional Quality for the Air Technology Network Program Management Office (ATN PMO), an organization within Air University, Air Education & Training Command. The ATN PMO provides satellite programming to military personnel and government employees across the Department of Defense.
