Aftermath of General Conference 2019

In my years of ministry, I have never had an event or situation that generated as much discussion as the business before the February special session General Conference of the United Methodist Church regarding a variety of LGBTQ topics. The General Conference of our denomination, comprising delegates from all over the world--over 40% of whom come from countries outside the United States, voted to retain the current language that does not allow "self-avowing, practicing homosexuals" from being ordained as clergy and that bars same gender weddings from being conducted by our clergy or in our churches. Additionally, penalties and enforcement for violating these standards were strengthened and provisions were made for a "gracious exit" process for congregations that do not wish to remain in the denomination because of the position of the church regarding LGBTQ persons. The vote was very close (about 54-46%) with alternative proposals also being narrowly defeated.

Reaction to the decision of the General Conference in our congregation has ranged from relief and being pleased to disappointment and anger to mixed feelings. As I talk with other pastors I hear a similar range of opinion. In many cases the differences derive from different personal experiences with LGBTQ persons. Some of the differences are generational with the younger clergy and laity overall being more accepting of changing the rules than those in more senior generations. There is some concern about the different contexts in different parts of the world (for example, in some countries where we have United Methodist churches, a person can be jailed for being LGBTQ while other countries have legalized same gender weddings). At the heart of the matter are usually fundamental theological differences. Those favoring the General Conference decision most commonly view the "practice of homosexuality" as sinful behavior forbidden by scripture. Those unhappy with the decision most commonly note that they see the LGBTQ person as made by God the way they are. I don't know how, apart from being able to accept the reality that there are those who see it differently, to reconcile these two positions (if you have an idea, do let me know!!). Indeed, the option that would have allowed churches and pastors to decide which position to take did not pass. Although I do not believe John Wesley would have considered our position on these matters to be essential to our being faithful or not--one of my most important understandings of his being "If your heart is as my heart, give me your hand" meaning Jesus dwelling in your heart--it has nonetheless risen to that position for many.

The Judicial Council has ruled that most of the Traditional Plan is constitutional though there are a few provisions that have been struck down. Additionally, there are a number of petitions coming to the floor of the New England Conference this June requesting action from a variety of perspectives. Leaders in the denomination are also trying to discern the real-world implications of the legislation passed at this year's General Conference when it takes effect on January 1. I expect that in at least one significant way, the United Methodist church as we know it will change. How that happens and who is involved is anyone's guess at this point. There are several more chapters to this story yet to unfold.

My commitment is to take a pastoral approach with you whatever your position. Our worship continues to be open to all who wish to worship with us (the only person I have ever turned away was not supposed to be there due to a court protection from abuse order). I am convinced that God is not done with us yet, even if we don't know what the future of the UMC will look like. Please pray for our denomination and those who will be gathering from our sister churches for the New England Annual Conference session in Manchester, NH on June 13-15. CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES (includes previously submitted reports)
4-25-19

ATTENDEES: Roy Alden (Chair), Claire Hodgkins, Susan White, Debbie Barnes, Bill Thomas, Judson Drake, Rev. Tim Wilcox, Tamara Wilcox, Bobbi Pelletier, and Lee Frost

Roy Alden called the meeting to order at 6:33PM in the church kitchen as he asked Rev. Tim Wilcox to say a brief prayer. Next, Roy asked the members if they had any uplifting comments about life in our church since our last meeting. Some of the comments given included listening to the radio spots on X Radio and the activities during Holy Week. Also mentioned was the warm reception for the beautiful Palm Sunday musical service. Judson remarked on all the people and the food, some of which he personally took to the women's shelter rather than waste. Next Roy called for reports.

CLUSTER: Did not meet.

Bobbi Pelletier reported the following checkbook figures for March:

Bobbi also reported that the \$25000.00 Memorial Garden Funds invested with Thompson/Hamel LLC closed on March 31st with a balance of \$25,700.87. Our original cost to invest of \$1,073.78 has been made up.

Capital Account Seed Money had a previous Balance of \$42,525.77. March deposits amounted to \$494.21, no expenses, and an ending Balance of \$43,019.98. Of that amount the Furnace Fund is \$32,818.00.

Bobbi reported that we owe Dead River \$169.47 for the Parsonage oil costs and \$2,805.68 for the church's oil and propane costs as of February 28. Also, we owe Mission Shares for 2 months. The Pastor's Pension Benefit is paid up to March 31st.

Debbie Barnes reported on the Annual Budget as of March 31st and attendance as follows:

Tithes & Offerings \$41,261.75

Total Expenses \$52,071.58

Unpaid Expenses \$4,904.66

Average Attendance by Month 73.00

Average Attendance by YTD 75.33

The net income of \$620.00 from the Italian Dinner will be given to the Operating Budget; Debbie Barnes thanked all those who participated.

The Committee discussed a Stewardship drive for the fall and plans to see if the Preachers Aid Society has any programs for our use. The Harvest Supper money which amounts to \$1,522.00 has not been designated so the Council has suggested asking Del or Bob for guidance. If neither has a suggestion then the Council will make that decision at its next meeting.

Missions & Evangelism Committee:

Group had discussion during Coffee Fellowship on April 14th. The following items were discussed:

- 1) Rev. Tim had recorded Lent radio spots; committee had previously agreed to pay for them. Bill should be between \$250 and \$300.
- 2) Bobbi purchased an outdoor portable sign to be used to advertise events at the church. She asked the committee if they would agree to pay for it – approximately \$150.00. All agreed.
- 3) At last Church Council Meeting, the topic of people missing from Worship Services was discussed. Group thought a committee should make contact with these people and see what could be done to get them to return to church. It was thought that this could be an effort for this committee. Bobbi asked everyone to consider it and get back to her by April 24th so she could report to the Church Council on April 25th.

SPRC: SPRC Met on Thursday, April 11th to review and edit the drafts of the new job descriptions for a Pre-School – Grade 6 Sunday School Teacher/Vacation Bible School Coordinator and a Grades 6-12 Church School Teacher/Youth Group Advisor. The descriptions were finalized and will be presented to the Church Council for approval on April 18th. If approved the positions will be advertised and applications will be collected. The committee will look to interview candidates at their next meeting on May 9th. The re-design of these positions will not require additional funding. They will be funded from the existing allocated funds for the Children and Youth Coordinator position. The money will be divided equally and paid on the last workday of each month.

Presently there is no one to teach the younger children. SPRC is seeking a volunteer willing to become their teacher. SPRC has created a new job description for these positions. Also, SPRC continues to search for a new organist/pianist and in the meantime, Mary Lou Brown has agreed to fill in occasionally while Judi Greenier and Margaret Cyr continue most of those duties.

Worship Committee:

Committee met on Friday, April 5th at 9:30am in the church kitchen. The following items were discussed:

Old Business:

Status of Rev. Tim's radio spots for Lent – he was recording that afternoon. Asked him to include the Ecumenical Holy Week Services

Status of book holder Rev. Tim needs for communion table – Bobbi passed him a few examples of items available on the internet and asked him to decide and order one that's appropriate.

Status of obtaining appropriate recording equipment and software to covert recording to word document – work in progress; Judson Drake gave Bobbi a list of a few software options and she will check them out.

Outdoor portable sign – Bobbi ordered one and it was received shortly afterwards. It was used to advertise the Holy Week Noon Services and it was noticed by a few people as they drove by and they did participate! Seems like a good addition!

Feedback on Ash Wednesday Prayer Vigil – all spots were filled; feedback on "Ashes on the Go" – need more advertising (good use of new portable sign!)

Boiled Ham Dinner on March 16th – poor attendance, perhaps due to spotty advertising? Net proceeds were \$512.17 – donated towards Operating Budget. Still seeking someone who is willing to do the advertising (WAGM-TV, Rec Center, posters, etc.) No volunteers yet.

Bob Thompson met with Will Barnum to begin training him on the scripture postings on the screen.

Apr 14 - Palm Sunday – African Palms ordered (Diane & Diana will hand them out before service); palms fronds and altar arrangement ordered (Bobbi will pick-up); Claire volunteered to help Bobbi prepare the palm fronds on Saturday; Diane & Diana will hand out the palm fronds after service

Apr 15-19 – Ecumenical Holy Week Noon Services; Bobbi still working on securing all the day's preachers

Apr 19 – Good Friday Service at 7pm

Apr 21 – Easter Sunday; need volunteers to come in on Saturday, Apr 20 to arrange flowers (Bobbi, Claire, Diane, Diana); we will also have new members join the church – Melvin Griffin, Melonie Carlson and Erika Carlson

May 12 – Mother's Day; decided on gifts (Devotion Book); will order 70

May 19 – Heritage Sunday; three new 50-year members (Loreli Locke, Drenna Veilleux, David Silsbee); will send letters inviting them to attend Worship; will have a candle on the altar for each of them; that is also the Sunday for the pulpit exchange (no name yet); Lay Leader present

Faith We Sing CDs – Bobbi has checked the price from Cokesbury (\$355.79 plus S/H); asked Memorials Committee to buy them, waiting for an answer; they will discuss after they meet on May 12th

Judson has been working on restoring the altar area – as part of this recommends unbreakable safety glass w/rounded corners due to size of current glass.

TRUSTEES: The Trustees have received a mystery check from Ameriprise Financial in Minneapolis, MN in the amount of \$668.04. The company could not enlighten Judson due to privacy policies. The money was deposited. Lee Frost spoke up and said this money was in memory of his parents.

The Trustees called an emergency meeting to discuss serious damage to the church roof due to the loss of sections of roofing leaving the roof open to water damage. It was found that the original roofing was not well secured which might be a contributing factor to it falling away due to wind and ice. After much discussion on how to come up with the money to finance the roofing projects, The Trustees decided to turn to the Congregation for a conference as has been voted on at an earlier Conference, to ask the Congregation if it would agree to allow the Trustees to borrow the Turner Trust money (\$127,684.18) to pay up front for the Church and Parsonage roofing projects. It would take too long to borrow money and still insure the work could be completed in a timely manner as contractors need to fill up their work orders and therefore might not be available. The Trustees have pictures of the damage which will be shared with the Congregation at a meeting to be called for Sunday, May 26th. There will be a pot luck lunch after church service followed by a short church conference led by Chris Dare representing our District Superintendent with Rev. Tim assisting. We need to know if we will be able to use the Turner Funds by early May to secure a contractor. The Trustees will replace the Turner funds in the future either by borrowing from the Foundation using our assets or by launching a Capital Campaign. Judson passed around some bid sheets at that meeting. Judson announced that he has a secret source who has pledged a large amount of money, maybe even \$100,000.00 toward this project.

OTHER TRUSTEE BUSINESS: The Trustees have been approached by Chuck Moody of a foster parent organization (three to ten people) to see if they could use the Fellowship Hall on the 1st Thursday of every month. He also requested its use on Tuesday, May 21st for a special recognition night. The Trustees voted to allow the organization to meet at GMUMC. Also, the Choral Society of about 60 members is looking for a new space for rehearsals starting in the fall of 2019. It would entail a few months in the fall and a few months in the spring. They would want to use the Fellowship Hall as setting needs to be flexible. The Trustees voted to allow the Choral Society to use the space if they choose to do so. The Choral Society members are looking at other venues as well.

Del Ramey volunteered to be the spokesman to promote a new Capital Campaign when the time is right. Also, the Trustees believe it would be wise to have a consultant if a Capital Campaign is held.

OTHER: Roy Alden has to back out of his plan to attend the Annual Conference due to family arriving at that time. We need a volunteer to be our delegate to the Annual Conference in June.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 8:05 PM.
