Some of you have noticed that for many months we have occasional problems with the wireless handheld microphone in the sanctuary. Sometimes it cuts out right as someone is speaking. Other times the sounds seem to come and go. Plus, it is hard to predict. There will be stretches

of time where the microphone works fine. We would use it for a rehearsal or practice one day and have no problems and then we would have a problem the very next day during worship. We have tried replacing batteries, cleaning the unit and working on the settings in the mixer board. Nothing fixed the problem. Finally, after the latest hiccup the decision was made to replace the microphone. To do so meant also replacing the transmitter that goes with it. This is when we learned that the frequency that the microphone had been using had been given for use in cell phone communications and was no longer available for our replacement microphone. Furthermore, the problems we had been having with the microphone's workings was likely caused by interference from cell phones in the vicinity of the transmitter and the microphone. And, of course, the time we have the most phones in the sanctuary is on Sunday mornings and other times of worship when a lot of people are present. It turns out that we were the cause of the interference. Not only that, we didn't even realize that we were interfering with the microphone's operation. The new microphone should take care of the interference problem.

The process of discovering this interference has me wondering ... have you considered how you interfere even if unintentionally—with your relationship with God? This interference (you might also call it sin; or from the Greek hamartia, "missing the mark") comes in different forms. It could be interference by omission. Perhaps you haven't allowed sufficient time for prayer, reading the scriptures, worship or meditation. Maybe you don't turn to God throughout your week. It could also be that the interference comes more directly. Sometimes, we make other aspects of our life into a god as we sometimes do with money, power, prestige, jobs or appearances. Sometimes, we lose perspective on the entire Gospel message of God's love for all his people. I see this in those across the world at the moment whose primary appeal is to our fears and our worries.

Wherever the source of the interference in your life, if we are unable to find the frequencies that will restore good communication with God, we cut ourselves off from the giver of life and the author of our faith. Most of us would say that we would not want to be cut off from God, yet our human condition often means we end up doing the very thing we would ordinarily hope to avoid.

What in your life causes interference with your relationship with God? What clues do you have that some of this interference is just beyond your ability to see it? How might you identify such hidden interference? What steps would you take to overcome this interference? How do you reduce the chances of that interference from reappearing? As you find affirmative answers to these questions, you connect with a central part of the Gospel: God wants a relationship with each of us and will go to great lengths to have it, even when our human tendencies get in the way. And, even when interference gets in the way of our relationship with God, God still loves us. Such good news indeed! My prayer is that you will clear the interference from your life (at least most of the time) so you can live more fully in the presence of God's grace, joy and peace.

New Study for 2019-2020 Still room for additional people!

Companions in Christ offers small groups a powerfully transforming experience in spiritual formation. CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 8-22-19

<u>Members in Attendance</u>: Roy Alden, Leland Frost, Rev. Tim Wilcox, Tamara Wilcox, Bobbi Pelletier, Mary Lou Brown, Neal Genz, Bill Thomas, Melonie Carlson, Alaina Pethick, Debbie Barnes, Judson Drake

Roy Alden opened the meeting with prayer at 6:42pm.

We then gave brief testimonials reflecting on what makes Gray Memorial unique and special to us. For example: Judson talked about the light reflecting through the windows on a sunny day and how God's spirit was being distributed throughout the church; Melonie told us how open and receptive the church had been to her family and how she felt God's presence in each of the members of our church; Neal and Bobbi both expressed their love for the church and how the church was their family and the reason they continued to live here even though their families resided far away.

Roy called for committee reports. The following committee reports were submitted prior to the meeting:

<u>Education</u>: The Education Committee met for the first time in quite some time at the end of July. Josselyn Langworthy and Michele Sterner provided information regarding the programs they are planning for Sunday school. The start date was set as August 25. The Blessing of the Backpacks will also be held on that date.

Much discussion was had regarding past events and activities as well as ideas for new ones. The committee decided to continue with the annual Christmas tree sales. Our church participated in the "Caribou Cares About Kids" parade, giving out treats and information about Sunday school. We hosted the Supreme Court Jesters Magic and Juggling Act. Special thanks to Josselyn for arranging that. Several other ideas for upcoming events included a youth rally at the roller rink, a drumming/exercise program for older children, and guest speakers. Further discussion and planning is needed for these.

The committee also addressed the concern about lack of volunteers and low attendance at events. Our main goal this year is to draw in more people and build these programs up. Some discussion was held regarding other potential members for this committee.

A meeting was scheduled for August 18, but needed to be rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances. That date is to be determined. The agenda is to begin planning for fall and winter activities.

Memorials: No Report

<u>Mission & Evangelism Committee</u>: Next meeting is scheduled for Sunday, September 15th to discuss the Cookie Booth in October.

<u>SPRC</u>: The SPRC met on Thursday, August 15, 2019 in the church kitchen. The agenda included discussion about the Church Conference scheduled September 15 and documents and tasks needing attention to be ready for that meeting. The committee discussed the pastor's salary for 2020. Motion was made by Jean, seconded by Ruthann to recommend a salary adjustment as follows: 2020 salary at \$51,000 with an additional \$1,000 for social security, \$2,000 for the Pastor's pension and an estimated \$18,263 for health insurance premiums. Reimbursements levels were held at the 2019 level, for Pastor travel at \$4,250 and continuing education at \$1,250. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion followed about the committee's plan to meet the Discipline's requirement for annual staff evaluations. An evaluation tool was selected as was an employee self-evaluation tool. The committee plans to have the self-evaluation tools distributed among staff by Sunday, August 18 with appointments following for each staff member with conclusion to occur before the October meeting.

Worship Committee: At our August 2nd meeting, the following was discussed:

Still waiting on status of upgraded computer, sound, screens, etc. that we hope will get donated. Also hope to purchase equipment & software to record and transcribe sermons and meetings.

We plan to take a break from using the Marcia McFee Worship Design Studio sermon series for a while and follow the liturgical calendar.

We still need more acolytes (Note: we made announcements and spoke to several people and currently have some new people starting soon.)

Outdoor Worship Service at Collins Pond Park scheduled for August 18th with a rain-date of August 25th. Discussed all the particulars.

Mission Project for collecting items for local school children will begin again on August 11th.

Discussed upcoming Sundays and noted any special items related to each:

- Aug 4: Mary Lou preaching
- Aug 11: Communion Sunday
- Aug 18: Friedrich Wilcox's last Sunday with us; plan to present him with a prayer shawl and ask Rev. Tim to let us have a laying on of hands and blessing.
- Aug 25: Richard Clark preaching
- Sep 1: Communion Sunday
- Sep 8: Dan Schall In Concert; Grandparents' Day
- Sep 29: Senior Choir returns
- Oct 6: World Communion Sunday (special offering) Margaret Cyr volunteered to do the altar arrangement
- Oct 20: Laity Sunday; Bobbi presented a suggestion on what to do during the service to recognize contributions of our laity; will discuss more at September meeting

Committee discussed a possible additional service; what day? What type? We decided to suggest to Rev. Tim (not present) that we should offer a Saturday 4pm 30-minute service. More discussion will occur at next meeting.

In September, Coffee Fellowship will change as committee decided to stop asking committees to provide food except on the 1st Sunday. Have not heard any comments on this as yet.

Our next meeting is Friday, August 30th at 9:30am (changed from Sep 6th)

Roy asked if any committee wished to highlight or add any information to their reports -

Worship Committee – Bobbi told everyone that a new hand-held microphone and transmitter was purchased and will be more reliable than the previous one.

Trustees – Judson told everyone the extent of the work accomplished on the church & parsonage roofs. He also said the total cost was \$157,000. We received an additional \$50,000 to help complete this project and remainder will be used for more needed work.

These Church Council Minutes include these additional reports presented at the Church Council Meeting:

<u>Cluster</u>: No report.

<u>Finance/Stewardship</u>: Financial reports for July 2019 were reviewed. Tamara Wilcox's report showed the regular offerings were \$14,489.12, with reimbursements of \$11.00. Special Funds for Church Use amounted to \$903.00. Special Funds Not for Church Use was \$20. The total donations received in July came to \$15,423.12.

Bobbi Pelletier reports reflected the following for July:

Bobbi's Expense report shows that an average of 4,246.45 is needed weekly. We are behind five months in Mission Shares, which is a total of 12,251.65. The monthly Pastor's Pension benefit of 794.69 was paid. Our Dead River balances as of July 31^{st} are Church = (407.01) and Parsonage = (170.57). Our monthly costs are Church 1,085 and Parsonage 276.

Melonie's report on our Budget was as follows:

The annual Budget for 2019 is \$220,815.26 which requires \$18,401.27 monthly and \$4,246.45 weekly. We are 58% through this year's budget and the following are the July numbers:

Target= \$128,808.90; Tithes & Offerings= \$100,138.27; Total Expenses= \$121,890.65; Unpaid Expenses= \$12,251.65.

The only unpaid expenses are our Mission Shares (five months).

Our average monthly attendance for July was 68 and the average YTD attendance is 75.

Melonie had copies of the 2018 Audit Report and passed several copies of the Fund Balance Report on to the various Church Council members. The Fund Balance Report will be included in the September 15th Church Conference booklet.

At the June 2019 Finance/Stewardship Committee meeting, a discussion about the financial status of the operating budget was held. Bobbi was unable to attend the meeting, but had informed the group of her concern regarding having sufficient donations each month to cover the church's bills. She asked the committee for approval to use the approximately \$18,000 in the checkbook under "Special Funds for Church Use" as a buffer to support spending more than received in monthly operating budget donations. The committee agreed to allow spending up to \$2,000 more than the monthly donations, if it was necessary. This was then brought forward to the Church Council so that the group was aware of this financial situation. Note: During the August 21st Finance/Stewardship meeting, Bobbi informed the committee that she expects to use up some of the approved \$2,000 to cover August expenses. She also will receive and have to pay two once-a-year payments in September – the 2019 Real Estate Taxes for the Parsonage (\$2,020.47) and 20% of the annual property insurance which was \$1,837.00 last year. She felt the \$2,000 allowance approved in June needed to be increased to \$4,000 for September, just in case donations received are not enough. The Finance/Stewardship Committee agreed and approved this increase. That item was also brought forward to the Church Council and was approved.

Due to the situation described in June in the previous paragraph, a suggestion was made during the June 2019 Church Council meeting to draft a letter to the congregation and Kathleen Forbes agreed to draft it. Unfortunately, with her illness shortly after that meeting, the letter was never drafted. During this August meeting, Mary Lou Brown and Melonie Carlson agreed to draft a letter to be mailed out to the congregation outlining our current financial situation with suggestions of what might be done to rectify the current crisis.

The Finance/Stewardship Committee has agreed to provide a hot dog & bean supper for the Kids' Marathon participants and volunteers on Saturday, September 14th. The City will reimburse us for all associated expenses and give us a \$500 stipend. The committee has discussed all the needed supplies and has made contacts to obtain them. The congregation is asked to volunteer to help at the supper and provide brownies for the desserts.

SPRC presented a proposed Pastor Compensation Salary package that must be voted on by the Church Council before it can be presented for vote at the Church Conference in September. The package calls for \$1,000 increase in the Pastor salary and a small increase in the cost of health insurance. The package was previously approved by the Finance/Stewardship Committee. A motion was made by Bill Thomas and seconded by Mary Lou Brown to approve the financial package as presented. After brief discussion the package was approved. The vote was 8 to 0 with three members abstaining because they are employees of the church.

Rev. Tim asked that the Nominations Report approved at the June 23rd Special Church Conference be updated due to changes in who would serve on the Staff Parish Relations Committee. Debbie Pringnitz is coming off the committee. Shirley Bowman (serve until June 2021) and Karen White (serve until June 2022) were nominated and approved unanimously to serve on the committee.

In May, a Lay Visitation Team was formed and trained to contact members/constituents of our church who currently are not attending. The committee will be meeting again in the next few weeks to discuss the final results of their effort. They will prepare a report to give to SPRC to demonstrate the results of their team's contacts.

The upcoming Church Conference will be September 15 at 2:30pm. Those of you who are committee/group chairs are reminded to get your reports to Bobbi by Tuesday, September 3rd at 10:00am so the Church Conference Booklet can be prepared.

<u>Trustees</u>: Discussion about the new Capital Campaign – Judson Drake presented the upcoming "Growing in Faith" campaign and explained that the benefit of this campaign is to take over where the last campaign (Sharing the Grace) stopped. We will focus this part on safety and structure and the list of what work and estimated cost that will be included is as follows:

1. Sprinkler in sanctuary	\$10,000
2. Electrical (old wiring) – church & parsonage	\$14,000
3. Structural	\$17,000
4. Safety exits (2 doors, ladder, steep steps)	\$8,200
5. Trip hazard (hot top walkways)	\$10,900
