

I didn't fully grasp what I was seeing. Just moments earlier I had heard unusual sounds. A pastor usually is so attuned to the church building that they know the hum of the lights, the vibrations of a door closing, the sounds of the building creaking in the wind and the din of traffic on the street. Something wasn't right. When I turned around to look I saw water coming from the ceiling. Instinctively, I ran downstairs to get a garbage container thinking I could catch the water. On my way up the back stairs I was met with a knock at the back door. It was an officer from the Caribou PD. As we climbed up to the sanctuary, his presence and questions

made me realize something bigger was going on (for whatever reason, I had not heard the alarm ringing outside the church building). When I reached the altar I froze for several seconds. As I was looking at it, water was pouring down from an area just to the left of the ceiling fan most of the way toward the north wall about half way up the seating area on that side and back to the edge of the balcony. It was like a waterfall, pouring through light fixtures, sprinkler head openings and seams in the tin ceiling. There was a river of water running down the slope of the sanctuary floor to the chancel, gathering in a pool several inches deep. This large garbage container in my hand was but a drop in the bucket, literally, compared to the need. At this point, I didn't know the cause of this indoor cloudburst. But, I DID have a good imagination. I remember thinking, "Oh my \@#!&, maybe this is the end of this space as we know it..." When have you wondered if what you were experiencing in life was the sudden beginning of one part of your life or the end of another? Sometimes we have time to prepare for these moments and sometimes they are imposed upon us, ready or not. I thought I could be looking at one of those moments. As I was looking out from the chancel to the cascading water, I felt powerless before the water – this was not the kind of baptism I had in mind. Though I have long believed "the church is not a building....the church is the people," the truth is that I have come to love both the people and this space we know as the Gray Memorial UMC. It is an inspiring place to worship. I was reminded of this as I noticed one of the contractors in the building during the water mitigation. She was gazing about the sanctuary, taking it all in. I knew deep down that if our building ceased to be, we would be OK. God would find a way. Unless we choose to do it on our own, I very much take to heart the words from Romans that "nothing can separate us from the love of God" - not even an indoor rainstorm. I could understand in a way that I had not before why so many of the people I know with the deepest faith have modest to little means as the world defines it. They do not look to their possessions, their money, their house, their sports heroes or even other people, ultimately, for their help in times of trouble. As the Psalmist says, their help is in the Lord. From whom or what do you rely on? From where does your help come? We have had a vivid reminder that as Christians that our help comes from God who is Emmanuel, God with us. I invite you to live into this reality as we begin the new year.

A huge thank you to all the people (Shelby Barnes made the first call into the fire station; our Trustees; and so many of you) and organizations (the Caribou Fire Department and Caribou Police Department were great to work with) who assisted us in some way (including prayers and workers from several of our cluster churches and from the Caribou Assembly of God Church that hosted our Blue Christmas service) in stabilizing our situation when water was pouring in the sanctuary to those who helped clean up and restore our church to usable space and to those who have shown extraordinary hospitality.

I pray that you will have a meaningful and happy 2020!







CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 12-19-19

The Meeting came to order at 6:43 PM in the Church Fellowship Hall with a brief prayer by Roy Alden. The meeting got started later than normal so Roy went directly to the financial reports for November.

Bobbi went over the checkbook figures for November as follows:

Bobbi reported that \$4,400 was paid in December to the Foundation for the final payment on the Growing in Faith Capital Campaign.

Bobbi reported that all expenses had been paid except the balance owed on Mission Shares.

The Memorial Garden Fund with Thompson/Hamel LLC had an ending balance of \$27,087.00 on Nov.30, 2019.

The Capital Account Seed Money account (CASM) had an ending balance of \$42,171.57; part of the CASM account is the Furnace Fund which stands at \$32,828.00.

We are now paid up through June on Mission Shares, but still owe \$12,261.65 through November and by December will owe \$14,714.02. The weekly average operating fund need for 2019 is \$4,246.45. Mission Shares are \$2,453.33 a month.

Dead River monthly cost as of June, 2019: C=\$1,085; P= \$276 (Increase of \$157)

Dead River accounts as of Nov. 30, 2019:

C = (\$3,239.18); P = (\$705.62)

Bobbi's report showed that \$9,809.32 was paid for Mission Shares and \$794.69 in Pastor Pension Benefits.

More money for the Growing the Faith Capital Campaign has been coming in that will be reflected in next month's report.

Stewardship pledges report: Operating Budget - Last year 45 units made pledges of \$129,000. This year 47 units made pledges of \$135,668.

The pledged amount for the Growing in Faith Capital Campaign stands presently at \$177,268.

Roy stated there were just two goals. The first was to meet the financial needs of the church. The second was to grow the spiritual needs of the church family.

The next order of business was to pass the Budget for 2020. After some discussion of revisions and eliminations, the Budget of \$230,211.75 was approved. Roy hopes the various committees will consider carefully before spending money as a budget is not a guarantee of funding which is dependent on donations.

Roy announced that there would be a cleanup at church this coming Saturday morning, December 21st, with a potluck lunch. Bring cleaning supplies and a dish to share.

The Council expressed celebration for the fast and fine work done by those who dealt with the flooding that took place. Bill Thomas showed members the sprinkler head unit that likely malfunctioned.

Members of the Council are deeply concerned for the health of Judson Drake, whom we hope will find a cure soon. We need him to be well. We hope he will listen to the doctors and do whatever it takes to mend. We will be praying for his recovery. His devotion to our church is wonderful, but he needs to care for his own health so he can take care of all of us and our church. His leadership has been a blessing. May God bless Judson and our whole congregation.

Our next meeting will be January 23rd at 6:30 PM in the Church kitchen.

EDUCATION:

Of course, we are still looking for volunteers as the sales continue - especially at least one adult for each remaining time slot and anyone physically able to lift and move the trees. Our next big undertaking will be beginning to plan for VBS.

Please note that Alaina will be taking a break from her committee responsibilities after her baby is born. She plans on returning in either March or April. Meagan Irving will be filling in to run the Education Committee meetings. Josselyn Langworthy will be filling in to represent this committee at the Church Council meetings.

SPRC:

The SPRC met on Thursday, December 12, 2019 in the church kitchen and began with a prayer by Rev. Tim. There being no comments by staff or parishioners, the committee moved into business.

Liaison reports were heard and a time sheet for the child care provider was introduced.

A policy for employees of Gray Memorial, in the works for a few months, was amended, and although not fully complete it was decided to distribute as is for now with revisions to be provided when ready.

A church profile in process of updating has only a few statistics to gather to finish that project. It should be ready within a few weeks.

It being December the committee agreed that it is time to thank staff for their service by providing a small yearend gift to each. Sunday, December 22 is to be the day to recognize the staff members and present gifts.

Rev. Tim reported on member visits made during the last month and about the status of the various studies and classes in process.

MISSIONS & EVANGELISM:

Angel Tree gifts/monetary donations were due by Sunday, December 15th. But, with having to cancel services on Sunday, several gifts are still missing as of Tuesday, December 17th. We will consider having a sign-up sheet with next year's Angel Tree gifts so we can make contact for any late gifts.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE: Committee met on Friday, December 6th and the following was discussed:

Feedback on recent Worship services – November 3rd All Saints Day: service meant a lot to those families/friends who lit a candle on the altar for those we have lost this past year; November 10th: Veterans were remembered with a carnation; November 24th: donated food items were given to the Bread of Life Kitchen.

On Saturday, November 30th, several people from the Worship Committee and the Missions & Evangelism Committee gathered to decorate the sanctuary for the Advent season. Tamara and Rev. Tim helped to set up the Christmas Tree and due to Tamara's patience, we now know how to do it! The various outlets were marked with different types of fabric tape so it will be MUCH easier next year!

We will host a Cluster "Blue Christmas Service" on Monday, December 16th at 7pm.

Christmas Eve Family Service at 4pm – the committee checked all the candle lights for the service and will have them on the end of the front pew for people to pick up after they receive Communion.

Forms for Christmas plants will be in the bulletins beginning December 1st; committee members will meet at church on Saturday, December 21st to arrange the plants for Sunday's service.

Bobbi has read most of the book "How to Start a New Service" and passed it on to Richard Clark to read. Diane Fitzpatrick will read it next. Once all have read it, we will meet with Rev. Tim to discuss and make plans on how to proceed.

We have decided not to renew Marcia McFee's "Worship Design Studio" subscription in 2020.

Coffee Fellowship – resuming light refreshments each Sunday appears to be going well; still some confusion about a special cake on the first Sunday – it does NOT have to be a store bought cake!

Upcoming Sundays & other dates:

January 19th – Human Relations Day; discussion about having a guest speaker

February 2nd - Discussed designating Super Bowl Sunday as "Souper Bowl Sunday" and accept monetary donations for the Caribou Ecumenical Food Pantry. Holy Rosary has done this for several years and gives the proceeds to the Pantry.
