On most Sundays when I am off, we visit another church nearby if we are not traveling or look for a church when we are. Not only does this practice help us keep up the practice of regular worship on Sunday, we also have the opportunity to hear different preachers, experience worship in different ways and glean ideas from a variety of churches. Some of these even find their way into my own ministry. Not only do we actually have an opportunity to worship together—a not too common occurrence for a clergy family—we also learn a lot about our own church and our faith when in a different context. When out of my usual setting, I can more easily see some of the ways God is speaking to me and to the church. And, in many cases, I find myself inspired in some way by the experience when I return home.

When you return from your travels this summer, bring with you a bulletin or other memento from your experience. I would enjoy hearing about the churches you visited, what you learned and how your experience might inform our ministry here at Gray Memorial.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 5-19-16

<u>ATTENDEES</u>: Diane McDonough (chair), Claire Hodgkins, Rev. Tim Wilcox, Shirley Bowman, Debbie Barnes, Bill Thomas, Margaret Cyr, and Judi Greenier

Diane McDonough called the meeting to order in the Church Library at 6:33 PM. Rev. Tim said a brief prayer to lift up our members in need, saying their names and praying for them ending with the council reciting the "Lord's Prayer". The Council approved the minutes of the last meeting as published and printed in the May Newsletter. Next, the following Committee reports were given.

CLUSTER: No Report

<u>COMMUNITY SERVICE</u>: Judi Greenier extended appreciation to the following Caribou Ecumenical Food Pantry volunteers from GMUMC for the month of May: Bill Thomas, Claire Hodgkins, Susan and Richard Clark, Jeannette Belyea, Debbie Nichols, and Joanne Smith. She also gave Bill Thomas special thanks to for working 7 of the 8 days the Pantry was open this month.

EDUCATION: No Report.

<u>EVANGELISM AND PUBLICITY</u>: No Report, but Betty asked the Council for its opinion regarding whether the booklets in the visitor bags should mention the red attendance registers that are sent through the pews during the Sunday service. After some discussion, the Council recommended that it was not necessary to mention the attendance registers. It was further decided to suspend the use of the attendance registers over the summer, but encourage guests to sign the Guest Book in the Narthex which could be suggested by the Evangelism Greeters each Sunday. It was also decided to make the bookmark cards available and encourage guests to write their information on them and place the cards in the collection plate. Debbie Barnes suggested we could make our own bookmarks instead of purchasing them.

<u>FINANCE AND STEWARDSHIP</u>: Shirley Bowman reported that the regular offerings for April were \$13,350.04 and additional sources to the operating fund brought the total to \$14,562.04. We had reimbursements of \$29 and special funds for church use amount to \$3,188.55. Native American Sunday offerings that were not for church use came to \$106.00 bringing the total offerings in April to \$17,885.59.

The previous balance of the Capital Account seed money was \$19,151.45. April deposits were \$1,549.83 with no withdrawals bringing the April balance to \$20,701.28. The total expenditures for the month of April amounted to \$16,848.26. Mission shares are 1 month ahead. The Dead River Balances for the church is \$4,147.86 and Parsonage is \$583.25 with no May payment due. The Annual Budget for the year is \$195,732.50 in April the Target was \$65,244.17. Tithes & Offerings amounted to \$58,484.55. Total expenses were \$64,785.74. All bills have been paid. The average attendance for April and for the year to date is 103. The Audit is ongoing. The Committee thanks all who helped with the Italian supper. The proceeds of \$1,044.00 was split between the Operating Fund and the Capital Account to reduce the "debt".

HISTORY AND RECORDS: No Report

MEMORIALS: No Report

<u>SPRC</u>: Bill Thomas reported that Rev. Tim will be gone with the Confirmation Class on May 29th and Richard Clark would be filling in for him. Also, Rev. Tim will be away on July 10th as well as time for a family vacation in late July or early August before school starts up. SPRC plans to complete the annual Congregational and Pastoral Evaluation at the June meeting. Sadly, the SPRC accepted Susan Clark's resignation as church organist. We plan to advertise in the local paper, job service, and use music teachers for contacts. Margaret Cyr recommended approaching a possible organist she knows but she stated that probably SPRC would have to pay more if this person accepted as she would be traveling from out of town and is a professional musician. Further, a job description should include times the organist is expected to play for church functions other than weddings and funerals. SPRC discussed possibly having a lay speakers' course within the next year, and possible candidates. The Committee also discussed rotation for a lay speaker outside the church, possibly Limestone or Presque Isle if needed. The staff and volunteers are well satisfied with Emma, our new child care worker.

<u>TRUSTEES</u>: Judi Greenier reported that Rene St. Peter had explained his proposal for repairing the block wall on the Prospect Street side of the church. He is preparing an estimate while we are searching for an engineer who can make sure we can properly secure the building, especially the stained glass windows without completely taking the wall in the basement apart. We hope to go ahead with this project by the end of June. Roy Alden and Dave Wakana plan to paint the posts on the new portico and also scrape and paint the church wall on the Sweden Street side because it is peeling badly.

We plan to rent or borrow a small excavator later this summer to do repairs to the back wall where water is leaking into the church. We plan to seal the wall with a rubber based product, then blue board in the ground against the wall to protect it from frost. The Trustees discussed the church use policy as it relates to fees assessed of non-members versus members as well as non-profit groups versus profit groups. Rev. Tim is preparing a final draft of the policy to be reviewed at our next Trustee meeting. If anyone wishes to comment or express an opinion feel free to talk to a Trustee. The Trustees will

be having a new hooded microwave oven installed in the parsonage very soon. The church has a leak in the north tower so we are contacting various companies with a lift so we can assess the cause and how best to address it and fix the problem. The Parsonage furnace has been replaced and the Trustees are looking at options for a water heater. The Trustees discussed in detail the replacement of the carpet and sub-flooring in the Fellowship Hall and decided that the cement walls need to get finished first. There is a difference of opinion as to whether to put down carpeting or some new type of flooring. This will be an expensive project but appropriate for the use of Capital funds. The Trustees plan to form a subcommittee to research possibilities. This Saturday, May 21st, the Men's Club will be cleaning out the storage shed and holding a yard sale. If anyone wishes to help or if anyone has anything in the shed that should be retained, contact Neal Genz or Roy Alden.

If not we may have to dismantle it and trash it.

<u>PASTOR'S TIME</u>: Rev. Tim announced the end of his two Disciple classes and his plan to develop small group studies that could involve a variety of focuses. The Confirmation class will soon be finishing up with a "Road Trip" to learn about another form of worship on May 29th as well as a mission project and a term paper in which each student will articulate a concept of his/her faith. This could be the most challenging part. New members will be joining May 22nd although some may not be able to attend at this time. This summer the Pastor and his family plan some vacation time. He will also be going to Camp in late July or early August. At least 4 weddings are scheduled between June and September. Also, he hopes to schedule a leadership Retreat to develop goals for the coming year. The Nominations Committee has not yet found someone to Chair the Community Services Committee when Judi Greenier steps down early this summer. It has been suggested that there could be openings for community service within the church but Bill Thomas added that a church person would have to supervise.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 7:50 pm.
