

A Word from the Pastor

In my experience, pastors take a wide variety of approaches to politics. While most of us keep up with the issues of the day, there are some who publicly take on a partisan approach, some who are outspoken advocates on contentious issues, a few who even run for office, some who are nonpolitical, and many who take a pastoral approach, desiring to minister to people from across the political spectrum. While I am in the later group, I sometimes find I am overly cautious in tackling divisive issues to a fault, even when our faith has something really important to say. Although I have my opinions about many topics in the public sphere (and am happy to talk with you about them) and will preach about some of them from time to time, I don't often venture into anything that looks particularly partisan except when I take a pastoral approach. Yet, there are times that call out for something to be said. In either a later column or sermon (or both), I plan to address the feelings—ranging from disappointment to utter despair—many of you have expressed about the state of our politics. However, I need to say a word today about so-called political correctness. Most of us can tell about an experience of overly sensitive language. Maybe you have heard terms like "sanitation engineer" (custodian) or weren't amused by a reading from *Politically Correct Bedtime Stories* and found yourself shaking your head. Unfortunately, there are people tapping into public anger about politics who are making claims or taking actions under the guise of political correctness that are simply not correct.

It is not correct to say that someone who is from a race, nation or gender different than our own is incapable of fairness...or anything else for that matter.

It is not okay to lie. Intentional distortions aren't much better.

It is not right to touch people in a sexual way without their freely given consent.

It is not correct to demonize opponents in the realm of politics as evil, satanic, or unpatriotic.

It is not appropriate to objectify women (or men) as mere possessions or exploits.

It is not okay for public figures to put themselves above the law.

It is not correct to assume that a few bad actors makes all similar people suspect (for example, a few radical Muslims do not make all Muslims bad actors).

It is not right for a person to use their public positions or influence to enrich themselves at taxpayer expense or at the expense of others.

It is not appropriate for demagogues to inflame our worst fears, passions and impulses to suit their ends.

It is not appropriate to use vulgar, crude, insulting, and dehumanizing language to describe our opponents. Such language sets a horrible example. As people like Susan Collins and George Mitchell have shown, we can "tell it like it is" without personalized and destructive attacks.

For each of these, we could point to one of the Ten Commandments, a teaching of Jesus or another part of scripture that reminds us of what is important in our relationships with other people. Perhaps most disturbing to me is our tendency as a culture, increasingly, to overlook serious character flaws in the pursuit of our objectives without asking for some measure of accountability. Should the ends really justify the means? All the same, if people of good character withdraw from the political process, I cannot help but see the trends continuing to run in the wrong direction. As I know many of you already are, please pray for our country, our election and our elected leaders. Also pray that God will help us see how we can take steps toward a more effective, positive government that doesn't depend upon destroying others or bringing out the worst in our humanity. While any change will surely take considerable time and effort on our collective parts, I have no doubt that God will be there with us.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 10-20-16

<u>ATTENDEES</u>: Diane McDonough (Chair), Claire Hodgkins, Rev. Tim Wilcox, Debbie Barnes, Shirley Bowman, Bobbi Pelletier, and Margaret Cyr.

The meeting came to order at 6:40 PM in the church library. After a brief prayer the Council approved the minutes of the last meeting as published and printed. Diane McDonough called for the following Committee reports:

<u>CLUSTER</u>: The Cluster continues to focus on possible Social Action Award recipients for 2016. Pastor Stephen Dale will be offering the United Methodist Beliefs class on Nov. 12 & 19 from 10 am to 3 pm, probably at Mars Hill UMC, but possibly Presque Isle, whichever is more central for easy access. This class can be used for advanced Laity study as well. Anyone can who wishes to participate can sign up at the Limestone UMC website: www.limestoneumc.org. Advanced Lay servant classes are available online at www.beadisciple.com.

The Bishop's Day in the District is October 27th at Hampton Highlands from 2 pm to 4 pm with clergy and laity together. John DeFelice is the new pastor for Mapleton. Ella Stevens coordinated persons to provide pulpit supply for this past summer. Chris Dare will be approaching the UCC pastor in Presque Isle to discuss the future as it is a Congregational church. Fort Fairfield will host the Thanksgiving Service on Sunday, Nov. 20th at 4 PM with potluck afterward with Fort Fairfield providing the hot dishes and salads and desserts from others. The offering will go to the homeless shelter in Presque isle. Donation of items will also be solicited for the homeless to be brought to the service.

Chris Dare will be offering the Fruitful Congregation Journey program, a free offering to pastors and laity, designed to build passion, innovative ideas, and develop new leadership in our churches. The only cost is the seven reading books. Classes will meet the first Sunday afternoon of the month from 2 to 5 pm starting in Nov.2016, Feb.2017, April 2017, Sept. 2017, and Nov. 2017. The first book "Renovate or Die" is available for kindle for \$10. Meeting materials will be emailed out in PDF form for participants to print out and bring to meetings.

Stephen has been approached by the Melody Roller Rink about having a "Church Night" for youth and adults. More information will be coming.

Stephen has scheduled an online Stewardship Presentation for Nov. 3rd from 12:30-2 pm following Cluster Council. Chris asked that if you have a church website he needs to know what platform it is on i.e. Wix, Weebly, etc. before the meeting so he can gather information specific to your needs.

Laity is encouraged to come to Cluster meetings.

Various church activities at Gray Memorial include- Women of the Bible: 10-11:30 am & 6-7:30pm Mondays beginning Oct. 15th, Redemption of Scrooge: Sundays 8:45-9:45 am & Tuesdays 1-2 pm, and Disciple I &II TBA, probably Tuesdays or Wednesdays. Check with Rev. Tim Wilcox.

The United Perish Church in Fort Fairfield will hold its annual Bazaar Nov.5th which includes a fish chowder luncheon for \$7.00. Limestone UMC will hold a Chicken pie supper Tuesday, Nov. 8th for a \$10.00 donation from 5-6:30 PM. Takeout will be available.

<u>EDUCATION</u>: REV. Tim reported that Sunday School attendance is down. Also, Del Ramey has found he has 200 Christmas trees that he will let the Youth sell if they wish to do that again this season. There are three Sunday school groups because there are only three teachers presently.

<u>EVANGELISM</u>: The Council discussed approaching Betty Branscom about the possibility of combining her Committee with Church and Community.

<u>FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP</u>: Shirley Bowman reported that the September regular offerings amounted to \$11,048.22. An additional \$250 for wedding, reimbursements of \$11 and special funds for church use added another \$941.85. Funds not for church use of \$309.00 brought the total offering for the month to \$12,560.07.

Bobbi Pelletier reported the following Checkbook data for September:

The Special Funds for Church Use has a total of \$8,200.04 and Special Funds Not for Church Use has a balance of \$362.51. The beginning balance in the Capital Account Seed Money account was \$27,452.33. It had a deposit of \$396.12, with no expenses, so on September 30th the balance was \$27,848.45.

Debbie Barnes reported that \$14,105.70 was spent for September. The Mission Shares are paid up through October. The monthly payment is \$2,290.33. The Dead River Balance as of 9-30-16 for the church is \$3,923.15 and for the Parsonage is \$1,018.87.

The September Budget line reads Target \$146,799.38, Tithes & Offerings \$133,622.32, Total Expenses \$137,408.65. Unpaid Bills none. Average attendance 88 for September and average attendance for the year is 95.

Debbie reported the 2015 Audit is complete.

The Committee is considering using the on-line banking feature at Aroostook Savings & Loan for Direct Deposit for Payroll, as the current vendor, VANCO, is eliminating that feature at the end of December. We could also use AS&L for direct withdrawals for member payments to the church that VANCO is currently doing for us, as their fees have increased in recent months. 2017 Budget sheets are ready for Committee Chairs. Stewardship Sunday is set for November 20th.

HISTORY & RECORDS: No Report

<u>MEMORIALS</u>: Diane reported she attended the Ecumenical Food Pantry Board meeting. Also, Claire Hodgkins volunteered to recruit workers when it is Gray Memorial's turn to serve in November and May. There is a sign up calendar sheet for November on the church dining room bulletin board. People are needed to volunteer on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 8:30 am to 11 am. We need 2 for each day.

<u>SPRC</u>: SPRC has been preparing documents for the annual Church Conference on Saturday, Oct. 22nd. The members will be meeting with the District Superintendent at 10 am and will serve as the October meeting as well. SPRC will partner with the Trustees to review and update the building use policy for weddings and funerals and a subcommittee of SPRC will draft a policy proposal.

The Passing of the Peace is in a different place to emphasize the "Peace be with you" element. Speak to Rev. Tim when asking for a special announcement. Please write prayer concerns on the sheet in the Narthex to save time in the service. Once a month, laity will be asked to do the "Children's Time". The Committee discussed people they thought might be willing to participate and a list was constructed. Rev. Tim will do the asking and scheduling. A flower chart has been placed in the Narthex from October 30th to December 18th.

Worship committee is looking at a Marcia McFee program for 2017 which Margaret learned about at Annual Conference. This program gives ideas for all seasons and includes all aspects of the worship service from music to scripture, children's activities and special services. One Marcia McFee program, "The Redemption of Scrooge", coincides with the book study which will be taking place in Nov. & Dec. We purchased this program for \$99 and will be meeting on Sunday to discuss if there are parts we want to use from it. There are parts that can include all aspects of our congregation with ideas for decorations, children's activities, music (choir, congregation, handbells), and special lighting. We can use a little or a lot.

TRUSTEES: Rev. Tim and Bobbi Pelletier reported that recently the Trustees found a big hole in the foundation when a trench was dug along the west side which is the probable cause of the flooding. It was patched and a rubber barrier was placed against the foundation before it was filled in.

<u>UMM</u>: The UMM met and discussed the chapter and topics for consideration for the upcoming year. The men voted to pay the Chapter dues for 2017, although they had the option to pay for 2 years. They also discussed the Harvest Supper and the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper.

<u>UMW</u>: Cookbook sales going well – plan to offer them for sale at this weekend's Arts & Craft Fair. All proceeds will go to the Capital Account Seed Money for replacing flooring in the basement.

- Finalized plans for our Soup & Sandwich Luncheon on Saturday, November 12th from 11am 1pm. We will offer four different soups (fish chowder, Confetti soup, Kielbasa soup and chili) along with a variety of sandwiches, followed by dessert (pumpkin cake with cream cheese frosting). Jennie Lyon Circle will have a bake sale.
- Selected four individuals to receive Mission Pins, to be awarded during a Worship Service in December.
- Thanksgiving Dinner: will start taking reservations beginning November 6th, with a deadline of November 20th. Menu will include turkey, potatoes, stuffing, gravy, turnip, carrots, squash, onions, peas, cranberry sauce, rolls and dessert will be pumpkin or apple pie.

Jennie Lyon Circle: No input received from Jennie Lyon Circle's October meeting.

Prayer Shawl Ministry: Many shawls were distributed to a number of local organizations. New yarn was ordered recently.

<u>PASTOR'S TIME</u>: Rev. Tim has been working with Sue White on revamping his schedule, rethinking workflow and how to contact him. The Parsonage inspection has been completed and the Trustees will prioritize a list of items for the year ahead. Rev. Tim would like 6-8 people to get involved in the Fruitful Congregation Journey with the Aroostook Cluster. Currently 2 have confirmed and a few more are considering. He would like at least one from the Council involved. There is more information under Cluster report.

As part of Rev. Tim's primary continuing education over the next 8 months, titled "Creating a Culture of Renewal", he will participate in 2 retreats and several assignments from now until June. He will also need 10 people of the church to complete a survey as part of the program. The purpose of the survey is to provide a baseline of information for him as we work on leadership skills.

Disciple II looks like it will meet on Fridays at 1 PM starting in November. Rev. Tim is currently doing a sermon series on election year issues. He will be teaching the "Redemption of Scrooge" classes during Advent which will be integrated with worship resources from Marcia McFee.

The Church Conference will be Saturday, Oct. 22nd at 11 am. Everett Cole's funeral will be Saturday, Oct. 22nd in the afternoon. The Building Use Policy is being updated because it has come to our attention that there is some confusion about the current policy. The SPRC has asked to be a part of revising the wedding and funeral portion of the clarified, updated policy. Gray Memorial may have some Christmas trees to sell this year after all. The Education Committee will follow up on this.

Bobbi Pelletier reported that Maine Preservation located in Yarmouth, an organization that she worked with during our restoration project, has honored Gray Memorial United Methodist Church with an award after she submitted an application in July in hopes of getting such an award. The ceremony will be on Nov. 16th in Falmouth. The affair begins at 5:30 PM with dinner at 6 pm. Cost is \$65 per person.
