

A Word from the Pastor

May 2017

An update

I wrote in this space at the beginning of Lent that I was going to try something I hadn't done before: make one day during <u>every</u> week of Lent into a fast day. Except for Holy Week itself (when I opted to be a "good" host of our ecumenical service luncheons), I chose one day each week for a liquids-only fast from breakfast to dinner. On one hand it isn't the most demanding type of fast. Even so, I was still challenged. Sometimes this was because of temptations around me – ask a member of the Disciple II class about the pineapple upside down cake. It was very tempting! Other times, usually by 1 or 2 o'clock, I would get rather hungry. I had to think twice about making a sandwich or eating a snack. A glass of water or milk didn't always fill the void.

Overall, my Lenten experience with fasting helped me to focus spiritually. I found that those times I was tempted or hungry when I would ordinarily eat did a couple things: 1) gave me greater appreciation for the role food plays in my health; 2) helped me thing about my priorities for food & what, how, and why I eat; 3) gave greater consideration to the spiritual dimensions of food. I was reminded of passages like 1 Corinthians 8:8, "But food does not bring us near to God; we are no worse if we do not eat and no better if we do." In other words, religious standards can be divisive if we allow it to be. 1 Corinthians 10:31, "So whatever you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." My experiences with fasting in Lent helped me consider my own priorities for food, health, and my faith. Since Jesus is our bread of life (John 6:35), we do not need to worry about our day to day existence (Matthew 6:25) so long as we stay focused on God. It was a beneficial exercise for me – even recommended by John Wesley, founder of Methodism. I plan to fast again.

How did you do with giving up or taking on something during Lent? Consider sustaining your progress in the weeks to come. What else did you learn about yourself? I would enjoy hearing your stories.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES - April 20, 2017

<u>ATTENDEES</u>: Diane McDonough (Chair), Claire Hodgkins, Shirley Bowman, Bobbi Pelletier, Susan White, David W. DeMerchant, Debbie Barnes, Margaret Cyr, and Stephen Cashman

The meeting came to order at 6:31 PM in the Church kitchen with a brief prayer from Diane McDonough followed by a vote to accept the minutes of the last meeting as printed and published. Bobbi asked that CHAIRS respond to her request for acknowledgment that they had received notice of the upcoming Council meetings and that they received a copy of the minutes afterward to check for errors or omissions. The following committee reports were given:

<u>CLUSTER</u>: The Lenten service in Hodgson raised \$177 for UMCOR and the Committee voted to add to that and give \$200 to UMCOR. The Cluster has received a nomination for the Social Action Award and reminds everyone that nominations are open through September. The clergy are invited to attend a gathering at Café Sorpreso to discuss "end of life" issues and "dying well". Check with the Cluster for time and date. Advanced Lay Servants classes are available on line. Pastor Ruth hopes to offer a basic course in May. The Cluster no longer can cover the Portage Church due to lack of resources. Lenten services were lightly attended but very spiritual. The Cluster wishes more laity would attend meetings. Pastor Steve will be moving on to a new post in Vermont this summer. The next meeting will be May 4th, which will be the last meeting until September.

<u>EDUCATION & FAMILY MINISTRIES</u>: Steve Cashman reported that his committee discussed exploring summer camps closer to home as well as Camp Mechuwana for our students to attend. The committee has not been able to find someone to coordinate summer VBS program. It may have to be canceled unless someone comes forward soon. The Terrific Tuesday program plans a puppet show Tuesday, May 16th from 6:30-7:30 pm. The UMM have offered to provided supper for those involved. The Easter egg hunt went well. Lastly, a new childcare provider will be needed for the fall as Emma Belyea will be going to college.

EVANGELISM & MISSIONS: No Report

FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP: Shirley Bowman reported the Tithes and Offerings for March amounted to \$14,445.80. Regular offerings were \$12,105.00 with Birthday offering of \$65.00 bringing it to \$12,170.00. Reimbursements totaled \$15; Special Funds for Church Use was \$1,688.80 of which \$1,377.00 was for the Capital Account Seed Fund, \$76.80 for Coffee Fellowship, \$75 for Youth, \$45 for fuel oil, \$70 for Prayer Shawl Ministry, and \$45 for Pilgrimage to Taize, France; Special Funds Not for Church Use amounted to \$572 of which \$373 was for the Camp Mechuwana collection, \$115 for Project 16, \$54 for Fruitful Congregation Books, and \$30 for the Caribou Ecumenical Food Pantry.

Bobbi Pelletier reported the March Checkbook figures as follows:

2016 Operating Income 12,170.00
Interest .83
Less EFT fee (21.45)
Less Expenses (15,180.08)
Ending Balance 1,622.01

Bobbi checked with Steve about moving the \$7.75 that was languishing in the Education/ Sunday School Special Fund account to the Youth account to get rid of a line. It was approved.

Bobbi reported that the beginning balance for March in the Capital Account Seed Money was \$30,883.67. Deposits in March were \$1,378.35 bringing the new balance to \$30,262.02.

Rev. Tim is officially a Rotarian.

Mission shares are paid up through July. Dead River Balance for the church is (\$70.24), and for the Parsonage, it was \$685.18. The total expenses for March were \$15,180.08.

Debbie Barnes reported that as of March the target was \$49,955.00. Tithes & Offerings came to \$41,232.99 and expenses were \$57,317.34. There were no unpaid bills. Average attendance for March was 90 giving an average attendance for the YTD of 88. The Committee is still working on having an audit in the near future. The Italian Dinner proceeds will be divided as follows: \$75 to Youth and \$895.86 will go to the Trustees to establish the Pastor's Moving Fund.

HISTORY & RECORDS: No Report

<u>MEMORIALS</u>: Diane reported her committee would be helping at the Caribou Ecumenical Food Pantry fund raiser Spaghetti Dinner being held this Saturday, April 22nd at the Assembly of God Fellowship building. Tickets are available at the door.

<u>SPRC</u>: Sue White reported that her Committee has approved the updated job descriptions and began reviewing the Church Profile. That document will be updated at the May meeting for presentation to the District Superintendent. The Committee will also begin the pastor evaluation process in May. The District is currently updating the evaluation form which will be needed to complete Rev. Tim's 2017 evaluation. Sue reports that the Wedding Policy is still a work in progress and in the hands of the Trustees to finalize. Reverend Tim will represent SPRC as the wording of the policy is finalized to ensure that a clear procedure is established for church employees to follow.

TRUSTEES: NO REPORT

<u>UMM</u>: Dave DeMerchant reported that the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper netted \$380. The invited speaker for their March meeting, Mary Green, new director of the local Red Cross, was unable to attend. The men voted to donate \$300 to the Friends of Caribou Schools. The UMM voted to match the church's \$115 donation to Project 16. The men also voted to purchase 2 new fry pans for the kitchen which Ken Peters will obtain. The UMM agreed to assist Michele Sterner with her Terrific Tuesday Puppet Show as well as help with the UMW's Ladies Tea.

<u>UMW</u>: The UMW Boiled Dinner was successful although not as well attended as in the past. There may not be another Boiled Dinner next year due to the lack of help in putting it on. Weather was another issue. The UMW Sub-District meeting was held at Gray Memorial on April 8th and a silent auction was held. Doris Jeffery was honored with a Mission Recognition pin for her many services. Dixie Shaw spoke about her Catholic Charities garden which the UMW recommends for anyone wanting a speaker. The UMW tended needs in the kitchen during Holy Week such as setting up and clean up. They served fish chowder, chicken stew, and chili with rolls and desert on Holy Friday, averaging 55 – 60 people a day. Thanks to all who helped. We will serve a Ladies' Tea on May 13th at 1 pm for ladies of all ages of the church, not just UMW members. Our one request is to wear a hat, either bought or made. UMW will participate in the May 20th City Wide Yard Sale by selling baked goods, hot dogs, chips, and a drink. We <u>will not</u> be selling yard sale items this year. We hope to sell strawberry shortcakes on Sweden Street instead of our usual pie sale. We hope to be able to get berries for 2 or 3 nights of the Thursdays on Sweden events.

WORSHIP: Margaret Cyr asked for feedback from the Lenten services, which was mixed. Holy Week services were well attended and featured clergy from the Catholic, Baptist, Lutheran, and Pentecostal churches. Holy Thursday service was beautiful and featured a meaningful Tenebrae service with Communion. The Easter Sunrise Service and breakfast were not well attended but enjoyed by those who did attend. Thank you UMM for putting on the breakfast. The theme for Lent, Holy Week, and Easter was from the Marcia McFee material entitled "Roll Down Justice". The Worship Committee decided to give Friedrich Wilcox \$300 for his trip to Taize which had originally been donated to the YOUTH (from the Christmas "Tree of Lights" project) with the blessing of the youth leaders. The Committee has purchased a new Baptismal font insert to which a liner will be added so water won't damage it.

Special Sundays in May include:

- May 14 Mother's Day
- May 21 Heritage Sunday- Three 50 year members will be invited to the service
- May 28 Ascension Sunday

The next sermon series will start May 7th called "Rise UP", a look at our faith in regard to Beliefs, Salvation, Suffering, Sacrifice, Prophesy, Judgment, and The Kingdom of Heaven.

Discussion points:

- 1. Use of Youth as ushers and greeters
- 2. Purchase of new plague for parament closet "In Memory of Ralph and Betty Bearce"
- 3. Possibility of women's retreat
- 4. Report from UMM on Father's day
- 5. Cleaning out the Worship Closet.
- 6. Outdoor service

The Committee, with 2 exceptions, will continue as is for next year. Anyone who is interested in planning worship is welcome to join this committee.

<u>OTHER</u>: Diane McDonough reported that the Bread of Life Soup Kitchen is in need of volunteers. There being no other business the meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm. The next meeting will be May 18th in the Church kitchen.
