I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. -- Philippians 4:13

In a recent conversation with a pastor, I was sharing some of my experiences this summer as a counselor at Camp Mechuwana. My colleague noted how it was hard for her to imagine spending a whole week at camp. When I first thought about counseling at camp, it was hard for me to imagine it, too. I enjoy the outdoors, but I wasn't sure about rustic living for a week. And, I have always found it easier to relate to adults, even when I was a child myself. But Bishop Weaver, our bishop at the time, had written about some of his own experiences at camp. He would occasionally spend a week at camp "incognito." To the campers he was simply one of the male counselors. In his letter he shared some of what he has learned from the children he has counseled and the impact they had on his life and ministry, lessons that were essential to understanding our youngest generation. Bishop Weaver challenged the pastors of the conference to spend a week at camp as well, especially if our ministries included or aspired to include children. Even if such a week was outside our comfort zone, he wanted us to not only serve the children in the camp program but also better minister with children in our ministries. So, in 2009, I counseled at my first camp, an appropriately titled "First Timers Camp." Every year since except for one, in addition to the fact that pastors and laity are central to the functioning of Mechuwana's summer program, I have learned lessons about people and had life experiences I would not have otherwise had that inform the ministry I do, open my eyes to more of the reality of living in this world, and that expand my skills in ministry. As I mentioned at the outdoor service, I had my first experience this summer working closely over several days with special needs campers. It would be an understatement to say that I know more about people with special needs (with a lot left to learn, of course). Although I have encountered it other years, this year several of the campers spoke of or were deeply affected by abuse in their life, often by their parents. One camper had nearly been murdered by a parent just before coming to camp. Every year we are regularly reminded of the difference a week at camp makes. For some it is the highlight of their summer (or life!) and for others it is an oasis in the midst of life's storms. Of course, many children are in a good place and you can see their skills and confidence growing over the course of a week, maybe share a laugh or have in-depth conversations (one night this summer after lights out in our cabin, I was pleasantly surprise by the conversation that went from the plight of honeybees to politics to favorite sports teams to interesting places they had visited). Experiences at camp find their way into conversations and decisions throughout the year. For several years now, I have preached a sermon based on my camp experiences from the summer. As I look back now, in being pushed outside my comfort zone, I have indeed been able to imagine myself being with people I hadn't imagined before and I have been able to function in ways I hadn't done before. In short, my weeks at camp impact my ministry and my life in a variety of ways. It would not have happened, however, if I hadn't dared to try something different that I struggled to imagine I could do.

How might God be calling you to stretch beyond your comfort zone to serve Christ by using your gifts in different ways? Maybe you have an opportunity to ease a time of change in your family or workplace. Perhaps the activity you once thought impossible, with the Holy Spirit strengthening you, might not only be possible, but leave a positive impact on you and on the people around you.




Del Ramey, accompanied by Margaret Cyr, sang two beautiful pieces during the Worship Service on August 26th!

Participation Survey

Companions in Christ offers small groups a powerfully transforming experience in spiritual formation. All resources in the series explore classic spiritual practices (for example, ways of reading scripture, forms of prayer, exploring spiritual journey, responding to God's call and spiritual guidance) and invite participants to develop daily patterns that open their lives to a deepening relationship with God and one another. The first offering is the basic course and runs 26 weeks plus a closing event. The course will

begin in mid-October on Tuesdays 10:30 - 12:30 OR Wednesdays from 9:30 - 11:30 OR Wednesday afternoon 1:30-3:30 with each session lasting two hours. The class will be limited to 9 people and sign up will begin on August 12 and end September 4. If you cannot attend this year's class, the current plan is to offer it again next year.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 8-23-18

<u>ATTENDEES</u>: Roy Alden (Chair), Claire Hodgkins, Rev. Tim Wilcox, Colleen Harmon, Lee Frost, Susan White, Kathie Forbes, Judson Drake, Josselyn Langworthy, Debbie Barnes, Mary Lou Brown.

Roy Alden called the meeting to order just after 6:30 PM in the church kitchen for the purpose of reviewing and voting to recommend the 2019 Pastor's Compensation Package to the Church Conference to be held at 2:30 PM on Saturday, September 15th.

Roy presented some ideas to the Council for streamlining and making the Council more efficient in the future. He asked members to be thinking of ideas so that at the next meeting the group can brainstorm ways to encourage more involvement by the congregation and more efficient use of Committee members' time.

Next, Debbie Barnes gave the financial report for July as follows:

Regular Offerings were \$14,086.54 with an additional offering of a \$50 donation from the Class of '68, and \$996.45 under Special Offerings for Church Use. Under Special Funds Not for Church Use, there was a donation of \$40 to the Jeff Cyr Mission.

Debbie Barnes went over the July checkbook figures as follows:

2018 Operating Income	14,136.54
Interest	3.20
Less EFT fee	(22.67)
Less expenses	(14,844.95)
Ending Balance	2,944.50

The \$25,000 invested with Thompson/Hamel LLC for the Memorial Garden on June 29, 2017 at a cost of \$1,073.78, as of July 31, 2018 shows an ending balance of \$24, 873.56.

As of July 31st the Capital Account Seed Money had a beginning balance of \$21,312.49. There was deposits of \$417.79 and no expenditures for a new balance of \$21,730.28.

Debbie reported that we are behind two months in Missions Shares but continue to pay the \$796.38 Pastor's Pension Benefit. Mission Shares for our church is \$2,433.58 /month. Guest/Staff costs were \$10,433.21 of the July expenses. Programs cost \$806.73. Trustees spent \$2,808.63.

As of June, the Dead River monthly cost is Church =\$955, Parsonage= \$249, an increase of \$303/month. Dead River balance as of July 31^{st} : C = (\$1,207.43) P = (\$66.05)

A review of the July Annual Budget figures is as follows: Target - \$121,006.96 Tithes & Offerings - \$110,542.61 Total Expenses - \$114,403.70 Unpaid Expenses - \$4,867.16 (Mission Shares); Average Attendance July: 83; Average Attendance Year-to-date: 89

SPRC: Sue White presented the recommended proposal for the 2019 Pastor's Compensation Package. Base Salary remains at \$50,000.00, total pastor's compensation is \$70,928. The only increase from 2018 Compensation was Health Insurance which has risen \$1,584, a big jump. Roy Alden stated that this is in no way a reflection of Rev. Tim's service, but one of financial realities facing the church. The complete 2019 package which was approved by the Council for recommendation to the Church Conference in September is as follows:
