The grounds of the Fort Langley Community Hall were insufficient to contain all the unique vehicles so many adjacent parking spots contained British-made autos.

Throughout the day crowds wandered around to check out the cars, trucks (or should that be lorries), camper units, motorcycles, doubledecker bus, and displays.

The show has been running for the past seven years and attracts all types of British cars, from the 1940s to modern.

Jaguars, Rolls Royces, Bentleys, Triumphs, MGs, Morris Minors, Metropolitans, motorcycles, a double Decker bus, and a London taxi have been displayed at past shows and were back again this year.

This year, a Sopwith Camel WWI era fighter plane from the Canadian Museum of Flight sat in front of the community hall.

Club members meet every second Thursday at Willowbrook Lanes.
