Progressive Muslim Journalist Mona Eltahawy Challenges Gender Inequality in Islam

Los Angeles, CA – August 13, 2012 – [Muslims for Progressive Values](#) (MPV) will host a reception, “Unshackling Islam from Patriarchy: An Evening with Mona Eltahawy,” at the Human Rights Campaign (HRC) Equality Center.

MPV's members and friends believe that Islam is inherently progressive, inclusive and egalitarian. As a result of MPV's grassroots efforts in invoking inclusivity, there is a viable shift among Muslims globally, and especially in North America, toward open discourse on issues such as women-led prayers and even LGBTQ rights.

The keynote speaker, Ms. Eltahawy, is an award-winning columnist and a widely sought analyst on issues of Arab and Muslim issues. Egyptian-born and New York-based, she has been described as “The Woman Explaining Egypt to the West.” As a self-identified, “proud liberal Muslim,” Eltahawy was in the news recently for non-violently protesting anti-Muslim posters in the New York subway by spray painting over them. Ms. Eltahawy promises to deliver an incisive look at the potential for Islamic communities to function and thrive “unshackled from patriarchy”.

In addition to the keynote, the reception will include remarks from Georgetown University Chaplain, Imam Yahya Hendi, a brief film screening of “Keeping it Halal,” a silent auction and a special musical performance by Ani Zonneveld, (MPV co-founder) from her new collection of songs, “Islamic Hymns.”
