

"Jesus No Cry"

Author Marlo Schalesky recalls her 2-year-old's first table prayer: "Jesus no cry. Jesus be happy. Amen." Her 5-year-old sister was unimpressed, calling it "a funny prayer." But Mom affirmed it as fine, later blogging: "I saw how woefully self-centered my own prayers had become. … [In my daughter's] language … they would sound more like 'Marlo no cry. Marlo be happy."

So Schalesky made some intentional changes. "Instead of only asking for God's blessing, I'm focusing more on asking God to help me to be pleasing to him. When I ask for wisdom, I also ask him to help me honor him in all I do and think. And instead of focusing on my desire for all to go well, I ask him what I can do to bring him joy. … I am learning to pray with childlike faith. I'm learning to pray, 'Jesus no cry. Jesus be happy."
