

Thrift Shop - Stop on Buy!!!



We are making these bags "Heavenly Snack Packs" and if possible, we would love to create enough to have some on hand for someone who comes by when the church is open and we would also love to be able to hand out one to everyone we serve on Park Place's Soup Kitchen Saturday (our next dates are

Nov. 23 and Feb. 8).

<u>Mission Items needed for our Heavenly Snack Packs</u>: single serve tuna or chicken snack kit; single serve fruit cups or applesauce; meat snack stick (i.e. jerky) peanut butter crackers, breakfast or protein bars (avoid chocolate), individual bags of chips, individual boxes of raisins or dried fruit, pudding packs, individual packs of cookies or a sweet treat, small bottled water. If you could bring any of these items to church on Sundays, it would be greatly appreciated. Please put donations in the box in the Narthex.


November Memorial & Honorary Altar Flowers
