May God continue to richly bless each of you and your families. In Christ's love and mine,




Advent Worship Schedule

I want to express my appreciation to everyone who participated in the recent Bible Study. We had 16 people who met faithfully every Monday evening from 6:00 – 7:00 as we traveled through Israel with teacher Ray Vander Laan. The study was entitled "Promised Land", which is part of the "That the World May Know" curriculum. Our lessons started with an understanding of God's plan and purpose for placing his people at "The Crossroads." We crossed the swollen Jordan River on dry land to enter the Promised Land, and no sooner were we across the river than our faith was tested at the city of Jericho. We discussed Samson and the importance of being a good witness in the world, and finally, our last lesson was about a young shepherd boy named David, and his confrontation with a giant named Goliath.

I am so grateful for everyone's participation in the class and their willingness to come prepared, having done the reading before class. In many ways each member of this class is their own "standing stone." For those of you who don't understand what that means, please reach out to someone from the class and ask them to explain what a "standing stone" is.

Our next Bible Study will begin immediately following Easter. It will be a six-week study discussing the various "Feasts" celebrated by the Hebrew nation, as explained in the Old Testament. Once again we will have a DVD to guide us, and I believe we will all be surprised by the manner in which each feast portrays and follows the life of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
