The National First Ladies' Library operates and manages the First Ladies National Historic Site in a partnership agreement with the National Park Service. The site consists of the Ida Saxton McKinley House, the family home of First Lady Ida Saxton McKinley and the longtime residence of William and Ida McKinley, and the Education and Research Center. The Ed Center has exhibit space, a Victorian theatre, a research library, a 91-seat Victorian Theatre on the lower level, where films and documentaries on the First Ladies are shown. Rotating exhibits featuring different First Ladies are shown here. Admission: Will be \$6.00 per person. If you have National Park Pass, entrance to the Research Center exhibits are free, but there will be a \$4.00 charge to tour the McKinley House. #### **KNITTING FOR A CAUSE**

A group of Hinckley Women's Club members are putting their knitting needles to good use knitting Twiddlemuffs for patients with dementia, and they are looking for more knitters/crochets to join them. We will be donating these to Kemper House.

Twiddlemuffs are knitted woolen muffs with items such as ribbons, large buttons or textured fabrics attached that patients with dementia can twiddle in their hands. People with dementia often have restless hands and like something to keep them occupied. The Twiddlemuffs provide a source of visual, tactile and sensory stimulation at the same time as keeping hands snug and warm. The soft knitted muffs contain strands of textured ribbons, beads and various fabrics attached both inside and outside.

In you are interested in helping out, even if you can't knit or crochet you, we could use help with sewing the attachments on the mitts. Give either Beth Crosley, Marge Palik or Kathy Schreck a call if you are interested.
