The first group of items are ongoing needs, the second group are for their "Kid's Closet", which is a fun shopping area where children can select their new, unopened item to take with them, and the third group are additional items needed for the center. Please bring your donations to the March meeting. I will drop them off, by appointment, shortly thereafter. We will, also, be donating much of the remaining Philanthropy Committee budget for their use.

Ongoing Needs: Bottled water (sm & lg sizes), Juice (boxes or single serve bottles only), Kid's snacks (individually wrapped, such as Granola bars, Goldfish, Fruit snacks, Pop-tarts, Instant Oatmeal, Mac & Cheese cups, Go-yurts, apple sauce pouches, raisins, veggie straws, etc.), Coffee, Sugar.

Kid's Closet: Journals with pens, Mechanical pens, Spiral notebooks, Markers, Small sticker books, Bath robes, Backpacks, Pajamas, Blankets, Books, Markers (thin tip - 6 ct, 8 ct, 10 ct), Chap stick/Lip balm, Socks (children & teenage), Scarfs (children & teenage), Gloves (children & teenage).

Housekeeping: Garbage bags (13 gal.), Hand sanitizer, Tri-fold paper towels (for wall dispensers), Diapers (size 6), Air freshener, Dishwasher detergent.


PROGRAM

As you may recall, Dr. Wendy spoke to our group in November. I just had my Raindrop massage and feel absolutely fabulous and smell wonderful too!! Heather had just quit her job to have a baby - and realized she didn't know much about Hinckley or her neighbors, (and also needed a baby-sitting co-op.) Cheryl and Heather are

both active grandmas now. Besides that, Cheryl, who now lives in Montville Twp., downhill skis, sings in her church choir, and does dog obedience and herding with her dogs. Heather swims, bike rides, and gives tours at Playhouse Square and Richfield Heritage Preserve. Last summer, Cheryl and her sister enjoyed the Ariel Adventure Park at Holiday Valley in NY.
