

Insurance Increased by \$5

Each year we pay \$4 for EDGETA membership and we paid \$8 for our liability insurance. The liability insurance part is going up to \$13 because it is “participant liability” which provides coverage for an incident involving another participant in a community parade and a member to member incident. Therefore, the insurance coverage will be \$17, per year.

Pecan Festival

Enter the complex from Sahuarita Road by turning north on the road which is on the west side of the large water tank. If you have a semi-trailer, contact Jerry Hayes and he will direct you to the north entrance. Your PFTP badge will gain free entrance to the grounds. Be set up by 9 a.m. Drive north past the buildings and unload your tractors. Engines will be unloaded at the engine site which is west of the ice cream and rope-making operations. (across the people lane which runs north) Trailers will be parked on the north end of the complex. Dry camping is free and 24-hour security is provided by the Arizona Rangers. Porta-potties, electricity, and water will be close to the rope-making and ice cream production.



There will be a silent auction for the donated International tractor with a minimum bid of \$500.

Old Tucson Heritage Days Show, A New Event

Ruth Senkbeil (240-1130) is the contact person for this event. We will use the Silverlake area and the North End Set will be used for engines, engines on trailers, and large tractors. Anyone who has a tractor or engine should have a fire extinguisher and a roped area around their display. All equipment must be set up by 9 a.m. on Friday and there is 24-hour security through Monday. Enter through the **Employee Entrance**. If you wish, you may come show only on Friday and Saturday and pick up your equipment after 5 or leave it until Monday. Pre-show set up on Wednesday, if needed but not on Thanksgiving Day. Entry fees are free to those bringing in equipment and they will receive one other free ticket, so bring your significant other. Non-exhibitors will be charged \$19.95 for adults and \$10.95 for children aged 4-11. Trailer and truck parking are in the South Parking lot.



Besides the three dry spaces for RV camping, you can make your own arrangements with the Gilbert Ray Campground which is a mile from Old Tucson. The Gilbert Ray Campground is located at 8451 W. McCain Loop and the phone number is 520-724-5000.
