Steven Manley, the executive director of IPEI (Ithaca Public Education Initiative), spoke. IPEI is turning 20 years. Tuesday **Nov 29** is Giving Tuesday and IPEI is asking ICSD staff, parents and alumni to celebrate by donating \$20. Brad Granger from the Board of Education spoke about future discussions regarding the lead in the school's water. Monday, **Nov 14** there will be a public meeting in the district boardroom to discuss this issue. For most schools, the best option seems to be adding filters to the drinking fountains. Enfield and Caroline are not using public water and the district is looking at other solutions. Brad also touched on the issue that the school district is not expecting much of an increase in state aid next year.

Liddy Coyle gave an overview of how the PLC (Professional learning) day went. The focus was on family engagement. There were discussions about "who is the community and how do they engage?" Everyone watched the TED talk by Chimamanda Adichi about single stories and then were asked to think about the stories we have.

Karen Yearwood from the villages at Ithaca spoke. The Villages provide tutoring services. They also have a family advocacy program and will attend CSE and TEAM meetings. The advocates are also available to help with upcoming parent teacher conferences.

The PTA council wanted to remind individual school PTA units that they need to remember to coordinate with other units (elementary and middle schools) to avoid conflicts. Also, check the district calendar to ensure that there aren't any other conflicts. The National PTA does have a suggested meeting schedule of the elementary schools meeting the first week of every month, the middle schools the second and high school the third week.

Community Conversations: Superintendent Luvelle Brown will engage the community in a variety of locations throughout the district to listen to the community.
