Happy New Year! I hope you had a great vacation, and are waltzing in to 2018 rejuvenated. We have a number of exciting learning opportunities on the horizon for this year...

We are kicking off our 3rd annual Month of Kindness in January, with a theme this year: "Create Positive Change". Each day throughout January and into February, students and staff work together to spread kindness and positive change throughout our school and greater community. Students design the acts of kindness themselves. Sometimes a class will do something as a whole, such as planting and giving flowers to folks at Kendal, and sometimes students will do something more individual, like thanking someone in the community who has made a difference. We believe that going outside of ourselves (and out of our way) to make things just a little bit better for others really matters. Ithaca Public Education Initiative

The Ithaca Public Education Initiative (IPEI) recently awarded Northeast and Fall Creek Elementary schools a total of \$10,000 for a grant entitled "Reimagining Recess". This grant will provide students with the freedom to explore, build and get creative with loose parts like cardboard, spools, tires, leaves, duct tape, wood scraps, etc. outside during recess. We'll be partnering with the folks at the Just Play Project (some of the same people who designed

the "Anarchy Zone" at the Ithaca Children's Garden), who will be providing training for our staff. This grant also helps us ensure that there's an adult responsible for supporting the play (often by just setting out and re-collecting the materials), as students use their imaginations, create, and have fun. We'll also be adding a shed, next to our current one out on the playground. Check

Now that the colder weather is here, teachers and staff need your help matching jackets, mittens and hats to the children they came to school with. Mark jacket labels with your child's name, add a tag to jacket, snow pants and backpack zippers or tie matching ribbons to all of your child's clothing.

You can also purchase printed labels through "Label Daddy" at *www.NORTHEAST.labeldaddy.com* be sure to include the Promo Code: NORTHEAST when you check out and you will receive 10% off of your order. And Label Daddy will donate 15% of your purchase price to our PTA.

Two-Hour Delay Procedure:

On these days, parents are encouraged to develop a plan so their children can safely stay home for an additional two hours.

In the event that a two-hour delay is activated, the following procedures will be followed:

- 1. Local news and radio stations will be contacted to report the delayed start, notices will be posted on the District website, Twitter and Facebook pages and emails will be sent to families using the SchoolMessenger system. Caregivers are encouraged to update their contact information in SchoolTool by contacting their school secretary.
- 2. If conditions do not improve within two hours, classes may be cancelled for the entire day and the same methods of notification will be made.
- 3. All bus routes will be delayed by exactly two hours (i.e. If your bus stop is normally at 8:37 a.m., it will be at 10:37 a.m. on delayed start days).
- 4. All schools will start exactly two hours later than normal. Elementary students should arrive at school between 9:40 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.
- 5. Secondary school doors will open at 10:30 a.m. Students will follow a condensed bell schedule of all scheduled classes. There will be no zero period at Ithaca High School on two-hour delay days.
- 6. Pre-K classes will NOT be held if a two-hour delay occurs on a Friday. This does not apply to Pre-K 12:45 dismissal classes.
- 7. Simple breakfasts will be available to students when schools open and regular lunches will be served at modified times.
- 8. Schools will be dismissed at their normal times at the end of the school day.

What is the Maker Space?


The Maker Space is a an area and opportunity for students to learn

different resources, explore new concepts, collaborate, create and invent with them.

Students can sign up to attend maker space two times per week during their recess periods. Our Maker Space is located in the library.

Five Things to Remember at Drop-Off Time



- Please pull up as far as possible when dropping off your child so that the cars behind you can pull in instead of having to go around and/or pull in front of others.
- Please use your blinker when you are done dropping your child off and pulling out from the curb so others know you are ready to leave. Be sure to look behind you: use your mirrors and an actual visual check.
- Please come to a full stop when you are exiting the "parking spots" area of the lot. Cars that are pulling in from Winthrop have the right of way.

When pulling up to the curb, never block the crosswalk at the entrance (where the sidewalk dips for wheelchairs and carts). This is where people cross from the parking spots and making people go around your car is dangerous for all involved.


to consider donating any gently-used snow pants, coats, boots, gloves, and hats to the school. We greatly appreciate all the help we can get to continue this important program.
