## Greetings, Northeast Families,

Well, spring has apparently finally sprung! We hope that you're enjoying this spring weather. It's hard to believe, but



we have about 7 more weeks left of school. Here's what's been going on, and what's on the horizon...

Our Makerspace continues to provide students with exciting opportunities to create and collaborate in innovative ways. For those who are new to it, Ms. Hulburt, our fantastic librarian, has been providing students with incredible learning experiences, called Makerspaces - places where kids get to collaboratively design things of their choosing, to invent, and to have fun. Most recently, students have been using simple, programmable robots, called "Ozobots". Students "write code" to tell the Ozobots where to go, how to move, and in some cases, how to illuminate. As kids

practice writing code, they can see the fruits of their efforts right before their eyes in real time. Another recent project invited students to work together to write, produce, star in, and edit short films using iMovie, on our iPads. Students designed and found costumes, designed sets, used their knowledge of green screen (something Ms. Hulburt had allowed them to explore in earlier Makerspace experiences), etc. to create some pretty remarkable movies!

They even had a series of showings complete with popcorn, to celebrate their work.

For the past few years, we have partnered with the Ithaca Youth Bureau to do a program called Marathon Miles.


