It's hard to believe, but we only have a few weeks left of the 2017-18 school year! We've had a year filled with learning, productive struggle, creativity, sadness, and strength. Although we faced tremendous challenges this year, I was so struck by how our community truly came together.

Celebrations of Learning are just around the corner. Most classes are holding these exciting celebrations, and will be/have been inviting families and others into the school, to participate in student-centered presentations. During said events, students take an active role in sharing their learning — both their processes and products. The idea of an audience of peers, families, and sometimes even community members often means that students are even more motivated to create high quality work, and feel a greater sense of purpose as they create. We've made an adjustment to our locked door system, which is that you no longer need to immediately show identification (license, permit, student ID, piece of mail, etc.) to gain entry at the front door. We are continuing to direct you to the office (unless you're just dropping something off), and still need your ID if you're visiting a classroom or other area beyond the front office or nurse's office. We will then give you a visitor's badge, and you'll sign in.

We are still happy to welcome all families and visitors into the school! Just contact your child's teacher, or me, the principal, to simply prearrange visits. You can do this via email or phone, and then we will add you to our pre-arranged visitors' list. These arrangements can be made far in advance or shortly before an anticipated visit. For celebrations of learning, concerts, and other big events, there's no need to sign in. We're hoping

that with more formal opportunities to come on into the school, families can continue to feel connected to the community.

Our annual reading challenge is coming to an end. Our kids have been reading like crazy, and we are delightfully proud. Ms. Hulburt (Librarian) and Ms. Snyder (Reading Teacher) have worked hard to set this up, and we thank them for their efforts. 



### Northeast Memories<sup>1</sup>

This June, Mutale and I will attend our third and last moving up ceremony at Northeast (for our own kids that is) as our "baby" transitions to middle school. It seems hard to believe that this place that has been a key part of our family's life for the last sixteen years will soon be in our rear-view mirror. The consolation is that after seeing three kids through the Northeast lower level, up the ramp, and back down to the "library wing" and beyond, the reality is that we are not exactly leaving Northeast behind but taking it with us wherever we go.

Our very first Kindergarten playground drop-off at Northeast was September, 2002. Our next "first" Kindergarten playground drop-off was September, 2008 and our final "first" Kindergarten playground drop-off was September of 2012. What a beautiful way for the young ones to start the day.

Over the years, not surprisingly, we have seen a lot of changes at Northeast: For instance, the Fifth Grade Trip for our oldest child was a three-day trip to Philadelphia! By the time our second child had his Fifth Grade Trip, the out-of-state, multi-day Fifth Grade Trip was a thing of the past and the goal was to keep the trip closer to home and have a day-trip instead - so they went to Rochester and Seabreeze. Our third and final one is planned for Greek Peak - even closer. Although Kids Count was founded (by parents) while my oldest was still at Northeast he never made it off the waiting list. For his two younger siblings Kids Count is synonymous with Northeast. For our oldest, and for most of the Northeast tenure of our second one, the Halloween Parade was not only a big deal for the school but the Northeast neighborhood as well. There was always the option for parents who did not want their children to participate to opt out and alternative activities were made available in the library. The parade was held during the school day and timed so that parents could come over around lunch time to see the parade alongside cheerful neighbors. When the parade was removed from the school day the PTA stepped in to try and keep the tradition alive and now holds it late in the afternoon but my impression is that the parade is just not the same anymore.

If I have to pin-point my most endearing experience of Northeast it has to be the sense of community. I truly believe we have the most amazing staff and PTA in the school district. Granted I am biased on the subject but over all these years it is so heartwarming to see families come and go but the PTA remains strong and dedicated to ensuring a rich experience for Northeast families. The PTA events such as the welcome picnic, movie nights, carnival, international night, birthday books ... just seem to constantly evolve and improve in ways that advance

inclusion and promote a strong sense of community. That is something we should not lose sight of. When we belong to such a warm, enlightened and safe community it is easy to forget that our community is not completely insulated from vices. Despite our overall rosy experience there have been some thorny experiences as well. For instance, my son was once called the "N" word on the school bus by a fellow student and I only learned about it because one of his friends was so upset about it he went home and told his parents. My child did not report the incident to us, apprehensive that we would come to school and it would become "a big deal". The parent whose child reported the upsetting ordeal called us to check on how our son was doing. I know from other parents that their kids have had some unkind experiences as well. A few years later FAB was introduced at Northeast and our second child participated in it (so has our youngest). The fact that Northeast is constantly responding to challenges through things like FAB and months of kindness gives me hope that the Northeast community is one that not only celebrates its strengths but does not shy away from identifying areas that need growth and improvement. And to see our very own Northeast kids look out for each other, is a testament to what wonderful people we are raising. I must say, however, that parents and staff should remember that the kids are watching us and we need to model the behavior we are asking the kids to embrace. It can be discouraging to see that Ms. Talcott has to still send out the same emails Mr. Tomasik used to send out asking parents to observe traffic safety and courtesy at drop off and pick up.

Another marked change I have observed over the years is in the use of the Northeast PTA Listserve. In more recent years it seems to be used primarily for announcements (events, programs and thank-you messages after events). In past years it was quite common for a parent to pause a question or offer thoughts related to the school, of course, and for there to be lively discussion. Although on occasion, the Listserve administrator had to step in and reign people in when discussion veered away from the proper purpose of the forum, it was often a place of healthy discussion on a range of topics such as homework, play-ground experiences, etc.

As we look forward to school winding down, and the summer ahead we are grateful for all the keepsakes we have collected over the years (holiday ornaments; books authored by our own kids; birthday books; works of art; Silver Graphics pendants and potholders to name a few), but most importantly we are leaving Northeast with treasured friendships and some indelible Northeast Memories.
